

FAVORITEFILICIETES

During our visit to the Rochelle Municipal airport three years ago, I learned that the skydiving operation based there will let visiting pilots ride in the right seat if it's not occupied with a jumpmaster or jump pilot-in-training. We arrived in time for the last flight of the day and the right seat was open! After paperwork, I greeted the pilot, climbed



aboard the turbine-powered Cessna Grand Caravan C208B and ready to go. The 8 or 9 jumpers on board were going all the way to 14,500 msl. It took about 16 minutes to climb to our jump altitude. We were only up there for about 5 minutes, this was the highest I've ever been unpressurized, and I could feel the effects of the altitude. After setting up level and about 97kts on the jump run, the plane became


much lighter as all the jumpers departed level flight in rapid succession. After checking that the jumpers were clear, the pilot announced, "Hang On, here we go..." setting the prop



pitch to flat and pointing the nose down at what seemed a 45 degree angle (I'm sure it was less than that!) We headed back to the runway. The VSI was pegged at 2000ft/min and the airspeed was just short of redline as we headed for earth. It was time turn down wind...from about 10,000 feet! The first turn felt like it was 60 degrees, and I sank down into my seat further than I had ever experienced. I'm quessing it

must have been 3-4 G's! The next turn, it felt like nearly 90 degrees put us on base. One more steep turn at about 500 ft put us on final for the grass alongside the runway. We watched the last two jumpers make their final approaches and land as we taxied across the runway! From jumpers away to touchdown was about four minutes. The pilot said he does about 50 runs per week, often as high as 17,500ft! What a ride! - TIM NEIDERKORN
