JANUARY MEETING

In forward flight the downwash from the main rotor of a helicopter is transformed into a pair of trailing vortices comparable to the wingtip vortices generated by a fixed wing aircraft and there is some evidence that these are more intense.

Think of a helicopter as a moving microburst.

How much wind do they put out?

How dangerous are they?

What precautions should we take?

Ned Parks is an expert in helicopter aerodynamics and will take us through this potentially dangerous subject. This program was originally planned as an in-person seminar but with the current surge of the Omicron variant in full swing, we have converted to an online only format using the FAA webinar technology. All you aircraft owners know about the biannual requirements for pitot-static checks. The chapter routinely gathers together several aircraft that need these checks around the same time and contracts with one of the avionics shops to come to 7G8 and do them all at once. INSTRUCTION IN EXPERIMENTAL CATAGORY A/C - LODA

Those of you with experimental category aircraft should be familiar with the recent Federal court judgment that makes it illegal to receive instruction in an experimental category aircraft. This problem was not caused by the FAA but rather by the federal Judiciary System and the FAA was very quick to come up with a workaround for this problem. Experimental aircraft owners must apply for and receive a Letter of Deviation Authority -LODA - or work with an instructor who has a blanket LODA. The process for acquiring this LODA is identical for the aircraft or the instructor.
