SOLAR ECLIPSE FLY-INS APRIL 8 2024

Our chapter will be involved at 2 Eclipse fly-ins.

On April 8th, chapter 5 will present our first (and probably last) Solar Eclipse Fly-in. This is an opportunity for pilots based outside of the path of totality to fly into Geauga County Airport in order to see the total solar eclipse.

In conjunction with the Geauga County Airport Authority, we will provide overnight camping and tie down spaces for all who wish to fly in.

Each aircraft flying in will receive **two free lunches**and **two free sets** of eclipse watching glasses.

Please plan on coming out to the airport to help with this event.

We will need people to help with the lunch service as well as aircraft parking.

A&PSCHOLARSHIP FORMED

The EAA Chapter 5 Board of Directors is pleased to announce the creation of an **EAA Chapter 5 A&P Scholarship program!**

As we all know, qualified A&P's (like airline pilots) are in short supply. While there is a country-wide shortage, EAA 5 is looking ahead to make sure we have A&P's here at Geauga County Airport. Just imagine if you needed a repair, or it is time for your annual and there is no A&P mechanic on our field!

Our solution is to "grow our own" Chapter 5 style!

We have identified **Matt Johnson** as our first scholarship candidate. Matt has been working with our own AI, **Don Cunningham**, for the last ten years and is now ready to attend A&P school to begin his licensing process. The program is 3 weeks long and the total cost is approximately \$5,000.

We are now asking for your donation, no matter how big or small. To increase the value of your contribution, Chapter 5 will match the first \$2,000 contributed. Given our Chapter history of generosity, we fully expect the fund to be oversubscribed and any excess dollars will be kept for the second A&P Scholarship. How do you contribute? 


