## Plane of the Month “Bleriot X1”

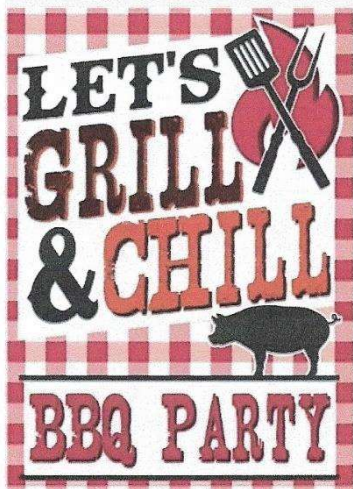


This was and still is a remarkable aircraft. It is the oldest aircraft in the world still flying. It was the first aircraft to fly across the English Channel. Check out the builder Louis Bleriot! In Rhinebeck NY is a great display of historical aircraft and automobiles. They hold a weekly airshow and if the weather is good, they will fly an original Bleriot. The aircraft was built in 1909 When she flew across the channel which was 37 kilometers it took 37 minutes at 50 kilometers per hour! This was, the first air over water record. When Louis landed in Dover, England, he was surrounded by people that were blown away by what they had just witnessed
