To access the shop, there is a combination "Key Box" attached to the door, contact any Board Member or Joe Bores and we will show you the code. Always return the key to the lock box and lock the door when you leave.

First off, we have two large workbenches that make a wonderful work platform for large parts (they can even be connected together for even more workspace).

Our stationary drill press has a ½" capacity chuck along with an adjustable quill that will allow you to drill a hole at an angle (few drill presses can do this). Drill bits are also available.

If you have parts that need to be cleaned, we have a large solvent cleaning tank that is filled with solvent that is pumped thru the cleaning brush. If that's not aggressive

enough there is a bench grinder that also has a wire wheel and finally a Sand Blasting cabinet that will remove paint, rust and corrosion.

The Chapter has a large 60-gallon Air Compressor and a host of pneumatic grinders, cutters and rivet forming tools or if you just need air in a tire, we have a small portable compressor and the fittings and pressure gauge.

For metal working, there's a large Box & Pan Finger Brake which will bend sheet stock and a very sharp Sheer for cutting stock to size.

We have a large capacity hydraulic-lift engine hoist and a horizontal rotating engine stand.

The long term goal is to have a comprehensive list of all the Chapter Tools. Each tool will have a "Tool Number" that will have detailed information about the tool along with a photograph. Eventually, it will become a printed list to make it easy to see all the tools available that will be available in the shop and on our Website.

Most of the aircraft related tools are in the large green cabinet. The tools on the top shelf have already had tool numbers assigned to them (it's a work in process).

To borrow a tool, fill out the sheet that is on the green cabinet door; bring it back when you're finished.

We recently added the following tools:

- Digital Volt Meter (Tracy Hille donation)
- Digital Vernier Caliper (Tracy Hille donation)
- Pop Rivet Gun (purchased)



- Engine hoist (Roger Munsterman donation)
- Engine Stand (David Grayson donation)
- Parts Bins filled with aviation & misc. hardware (Ed Beer Donation)Workmate portable work bench (purchased)
