Doug mentioned that the upcoming workshop on the 21st and 22nd will need to be set up on Friday the 20th. The aileron assembly arrived in a crate earlier in the day on June 12. Nate Hammond will be the instructor. Flyers have been posted regarding the August meeting reflecting the new 7:00pm meeting time and that there will be no July meeting.


