EAA Ford Tri-Motor Tour Stop in Frederick was a Success!!!

The 1928 EAA Ford Tri-Motor was a big hit at the Frederick Municipal Airport June 15 - June 18. We completed 46 flights with 431 passengers in the four days. This does not include media and sponsor passengers. We also enjoyed a steady flow of people who just came to the airport to get a look at the piece of flying history. Below is the breakout by day:

- * Thursday 7 flights, 57 passengers
- * Friday 8 flights, 74 passengers
- * Saturday 10 flights, 102 passengers
- * Sunday 21 flights, 198 passengers

Other noteworthy events included:

- * Photo event with an antique Piper Cub and four Model A Ford cars from the time period.
- * Media event pictures, video, and interview with the EAA Tri-Motor pilot).
- * Complementary media flight.
- * Static antique bicycle and motorcycle display from Kraemer Aviation.

Our results were a product of the joint collaborative efforts of EAA HQ, EAA Chapter 524, AOPA, Frederick Airport Management, and FAA Frederick Tower.

Meeting called to order at 7:01 pm by Chris Gunther

- Chris shared a number of updates: Ford Tri-Motor went really well. August 5, Maryland State Police Aviation Division (Trooper 3) open house. Chris will be traveling for the August Chapter meeting. September 8 and 9 is the AOPA Aviator Showcase. September 30 is the Frederick Airport Open House. Elections are coming up this November. Bob Miller will be the impartial judge, should he be needed.
