We anticipated that the program on the Hubble Space Telescope would be of great interest and the presenter, Mr. Preston Burch, did not disappoint. He covered all aspects of the project from its early design and construction through its launch and all of its contributions to science since. A big part of the program focused on the five servicing missions, starting with the first one to fix the mirror problem. I found those parts of the presentation to be the most interesting. I thought back to some of the challenges I encountered in the building of my RV-8 and the comparison to what the engineers and astronauts faced on a much bigger and more complex machine while having to operate in zero-g inside a bulky spacesuit was mind-blowing. One anecdote Mr. Burch passed along, though, was really amazing. He said that while all of the

Moving day. We started the day by finishing some last minute taping and ironing. Then the moving began with getting the rental truck and loading up the fuselage. Securing the fuselage inside the truck was a little more complicated this time with the airframe now covered with fabric. We had fewer places to which we could attach straps. Still, we managed to get the fuselage to the paint booth without incident and swapped it for our finished wing. As part of that process we completely cleaned out the paint booth and replaced the plastic on the floor. The next step is to thoroughly mask off the cabin. Once that is accomplished, painting can begin.
