## **June Chapter Meeting Minutes**

02 June 2022

Meeting called to order at 7:04 p.m. by Chris Gunther

- Steve Gross reported that the RV10 is almost done. First engine start was Tuesday night. The engine fired up right away, but there are a couple minor electrical squawks; no tach reading (fixed) and no charging across the ammeter (the wires were crossed on the shunt). Those issues have been fixed and there was no bloodshed or screaming. The DAR is coming June 18.
- Jerry reported that 3.5 weeks ago, he and Ernie decided to go flying. They met that evening around 6 on a beautiful evening. Flew to Keymar for takeoffs and landings (20 NM NE of FDK with a <2,000' runway. Takeoff and downwind departure around 1,000 feet towards Keymar. Jerry was going to enter downwind and noticed a powered parachute loitering around the end of the runway. On final, they saw another powered parachute being assembled on the runway, so they went around. Made a normal landing, did a 180, handed control to Ernie for takeoff. Ernie landed, did a 180, handed control back to Jerry and a 3rd powered parachute is assembling his parachute on the right side of the runway as they're taxiing by. During takeoff and about 20 feet above the ground, the 3rd parachute took off in front of him across the runway missing the parachute by about 100 feet. Stay alert.
- Todd Stock is building Bearhawk Patrol. Got plans in January, spent February and March buried in MDF dust from creating the form blocks for the ribs. Currently about halfway through forming the ribs. About 200 hours into build and assuming 3,500 hours total build time. He also made some supplies for youth to build wing ribs as part of a workshop. They were supposed to come last Friday, but half weren't able to make it and we couldn't use the wing rib kits.
- Ernie reported that the Veterans Build is coming along really well. Both wings and tail are virtually finished. Working on fuselage. Ran out of A4 rivets. Will finish riveting the sides and will attach to the bottom. Next build is on Saturday, June 4.
- Tom Comeau reported that VMC Club hybrid meeting went well with 1 joining online and 3 in person. Next meeting will be the same entitled "No Smoking, Please."
- Chris reminded the Chapter that there is <u>no July meeting</u> due to the July 4 holiday. AirVenture is soon approaching. See Chris if you're going because he'd like to gather enough people to do a pancake breakfast at AirVenture. See Ernie to pay your annual dues.
- Tonight's program was entitled "Overview of Potomac Consolidated TRACON (PCT)," presented by Joe Mash.
- 50/50 was \$92; \$46 to Robert and \$46 to the scholarship fund

## Charles Edward Kingsford Smith, M.C.

"9 June 1928: At 10:50 a.m., Charles Edward Kingsford Smith, M.C., and his crew completed the first trans-Pacific flight from the mainland United States of America to the Commonwealth of Australia. They landed their airplane, a Fokker F.VIIb/3m named Southern Cross, 1 at Brisbane, Queensland, Australia. The airplane's crew were Kingsford Smith, pilot; Charles Ulm, co-pilot; Harry Lyon, navigator; and James Warren, radio operator. Their historic flight had begun at Oakland, California, on 31 May.

The first leg of the flight from Oakland Field, California, to Wheeler Field was 2,406 miles (3,873 kilometers). The elapsed time was 27 hours, 27 minutes. After resting in Hawaii, the crew took off on the second leg to Suva, Fiji, a distance of 3,167 miles (5,097 kilometers). Southern Cross landed at Albert Park. It was the very first airplane to land in Fiji.
