In Memory of Mike Hendricks 1936-2023

Mike Hendricks, Aeronautical Engineer, Glassair and RV-12 builder, J-3 Cub restorer, and longtime EAA and Chapter 524 member died at his home on April 17 2023.

I first met Mike Hendricks sometime in the late 1990's when I visited him, Gust Mitchel, and Malinda Orlin to look at their early RV-12 project that they were assembling in Mike's shop.



They had completed the tail assembly and had one of the wings internal structure clecoed together on a nice flat table. I was very impressed with the quality of the kit materials, the workmanship on display, and the counterweighted cable suspended pneumatic pop rivet gun that Mike had rigged up to that made the cumbersome gun easy to handle.

From that day on I became a friend of Mike Hendricks and greatly valued his wry humor, practical approach to problem solving, and humility. He was somewhat reluctant to talk about his early days, but during our friendship I was able to pry a few things from his memory.

While in college Mike took a course on aerodynamics that was given by the famous aerodynamicist Max Monk. One day I asked Mike, "what was it like to be in a class taught by Monk." Mike replied, "he spent most the time telling us that we were too dumb to be aeronautical engineers."

Mike spent his early career with NASA at the Goddard facility where he helped to develop a sounding rocket system that used the first stage of surplus Nike ground to air missiles. He had some very funny stories about transporting the missile systems to the northwestern Canada launch site, and trying to encourage a cold soaked, solid fueled, rocket to ignite at the appropriate time.

Mike left NASA to start a successful heating and air conditioning business in Columbia, MD. The next time that you are in our chapter hangar, take a look at the heating and air conditioning system. Mike donated it to the chapter and installed it free of charge.

Mike finished the RV-12 and flew it for several years. I had the pleasure of helping him with a couple of Condition Inspections and was always amazed at his inventiveness and ability to design and produce special tools that made the job much easier. He put together a beautiful instrument that enabled us to balance the carburetors on his RV-12 Rotex engine in 15 minutes.

When the Frederick Sport Flyers group decided to restore a 1946 J-3 Cub Mike joined the group and actively participated in the project throughout the 4-year process. Happily, he was able to make one flight in the Cub.

Beginning May 15th, expert flight instructors and representatives from various aviation organizations will present free, interactive webinars. These webinars will cover topics from starting flight training, saving time and money in flight training, preparing for the FAA written exam, to passing the checkride, and so much more. While the live showing of these presentations will be open to the public, the recordings will be archived for EAA members to view at their convenience.

Learn to Fly Week will conclude on Saturday, May 20, with Flying Start events hosted at chapters across the country. EAA's Flying Start program allows EAA chapters to welcome, encourage, and educate new aviation enthusiasts about the fun, freedom, and accessibility of personal aviation in their local area. Following a short presentation about learning to fly, attendees will be offered a free introductory Eagle Flight to experience the spirit of aviation firsthand.

Learn to Fly Week was created to help encourage aspiring pilots to take action and begin the pilot training process," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program Manager. Way back in the 1970's, or possibly earlier, Bob Aymar flew the "Jeanie's Teenie" that he built at his old farmhouse in Glenwood Maryland. The Teenie was powered by a small surplus ground power unit that had some, ah... reliability issues. I first met Bob around 1980, years after the Teenie had been abandoned and he was working on a Sonerai. A longtime member of EAA 524 in Frederick Maryland, Bob was known for his inventiveness and his sense of humor. He always had a twinkle in his eye. In the '80's, when I was building an Acro Sport II, Bob gave me an assortment of fixtures to help with jigging up the fuselage tubing. He was generous with his time and talent. Bob developed a propeller carving and duplicating machine that he could tow behind his pickup truck on a trailer. He began selling props to the ultralight and RV crowd. He eventually sold the business to Mike Demuth who operated as Aymar-Demuth Propellers. Both Bob and Mike are gone now. Photo from the EAA 524 archives.
