
Brought to order at 7:04 p.m. by Chris Gunther

The 48th Annual East Coast Military Vehicle Rally will be held May 12, 13, and 14, 2022, at the Hagerstown Aviation Museum!

The Hagerstown Aviation Museum is collaborating with the Washington Area Collectors/Blue and Gray Military Vehicle Trust (WAC/B&G MVT) to host the 48th Annual East Coast Military Vehicle Rally at the Hagerstown Aviation Museum in Hagerstown, Maryland.

See privately owned historic military vehicles used in WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and Desert Storm to the present in the vehicle display area. Historic military vehicles on display will come in all shapes and sizes, including bicycles, motorcycles, Jeeps, Dodge Weapons Carriers, GMC 6x6 Army trucks, M Series vehicles like the M151 Mutt, M-37, and M-35 Duce & A Half, Wreckers and Armor like the famous Sherman Tank of WWII!

The Hagerstown Aviation Museum will display its historic aircraft collection alongside military vehicles. Climb aboard the rare Fairchild C-82 Packet, C-119 Flying Boxcar, C-123K Provider, and PT-26 Trainer. See exhibits and other museum aircraft such as the 1928 Kreider Reisner KR-31 biplane, 1943 Fairchild PT-19 WWII Trainer, and Fairchild 22 & 24, all built in Hagerstown, MD. The museum owns twenty-three historic aircraft, seventeen of which were built in Hagerstown.

Over 200 vendor spaces will feature vehicles, collectibles, medals, electronics, surplus, uniforms, radios, models, tools, books, vehicle parts, tents, insignia, and much more.

Museum merchandise, toys, books, DVDs, hats, T-shirts will be for sale at the Gift Shop in the hangar.

Step back in time and experience a memorable flight in the museum's 1943 Fairchild PT-19 Primary Trainer! Thousands of allied pilots earned their wings during WWII in this historic aircraft built by Fairchild Aircraft over seventy years ago in Hagerstown, Maryland. Experience the thrill of open cockpit flying! The museum plans to have rides available after 10 AM, weather permitting.

This event is great for veterans, scouts, campers, collectors, modelers, re-enactors, history buffs, aviators, enthusiasts, and people of all ages!

TAF and MOS – Similar but Different: All pilots are familiar with TAFs (Terminal Ares Forecasts) and are now getting used to seeing MOS (Model Output Statistics). Is MOS just a (botter) TAF, available at more airports?

Flying Clubs—Own Your Aviation Journey: You've earnt your pilot's license—now what? Join us to learn about how joining a flying club will help you get the most out of your pilot's license, share the cost of ownership & operations, and take control of your aviation journey alongside like-minded aviators.

Go Like the Pros: Safety through Smarter Training: Pilots who participate in regular proficiency training are less likely to experience loss of control and so are less likely to be involved in accidents. What we need is a general aviation pilot proficiency program—but you don't have to invent your own—the FAA has done the work us!

Expand your Horizons:

Pilots generally do not have accidents when in their "comfort zone", so it makes sense that we should train to expand that zone. Proficiency training in stall, spin and upset recovery techniques will help reduce loss of control accidents. We agree—but should we do something else first?
