Veteran's Build

Frederick, Maryland - 20 March 2021 EAA Chapter 524 members, Tim and Doreen Reger, Ray Buzzard, and Mary Ann Alvarado met with Robert Finn, Deputy Secretary of the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs (MDVA) at Frederick Municipal Airport (FDK), Airways Inn. The Veterans Build committee members met to discuss logistics, workforce, and facility needs.

The "Veterans Build" was an inspiration by some of EAA Chapter 524 members. The build's mission is for the education and social opportunity for Disabled American Veterans (DAV). The plan is to enable DAVs to create a flying club owned and operated by said flying club members. The idea is to make the flying club a not-for-profit for those members. Only Flying Club members will be able to fly the 750; test pilots, instructors (CFI) other designated officials will be allowed to fly the aircraft with the club members' permission and insurance proof. All Chapter 524 members are encouraged to help with this project's construction, provide expert instruction, or just social support.

The chapter has searched and received funding for the plane through donations. Additionally, an engine for the build was donated (rebuilding the engine is another part of the project) and the Zenith CH 750 Cruzer Kit is on order (to arrive in June). The 750 Cruzer is an all-metal high wing kit aircraft that facilitates construction with basic skills and standard tools. It is versatile, comfortable, and an economical experimental aircraft choice. Robert Finn has offered to reach out to the Maryland Veterans and begin the process of generating interest and finding qualified candidates. During Mr. Finn's visit to FDK, Ernest O'Roark exhibited some of the other cub's homebuilt planes, a Zodiac, and the club's Piper Cub restoration. A follow on visit at the chapter hangar brought him face to face with the current construction of a Van's RV-10. Steve Gross was on hand to explain the build, what he was seeing, and the time and commitment involved. The Veteran's Build is ready for takeoff!

Vintage News



In 1919, the Bellanca CE aircraft was designed and built by Guiseppi Bellanca in Hagerstown, Maryland.

Only two aircraft were completed before production ceased. The aircraft and spare parts were sold to Clarence Chamberlin of New York. Chamberlin barnstormed in the early 1920s in the Bellanca CE until an engine fire destroyed the aircraft. The museum's assumption is that this fuselage is one of the spare parts bought by Chamberlin in 1920.

Many years ago someone in upstate New York had this Bellanca CE fuselage in their garage and donated it to the Cradle of Aviation Museum on Long Island, NY. About 20 years ago David Paule of Longmont, Colorado had the dream of building a Bellanca CE and found the museum had this fuselage stored in its collection. The museum loaned the fuselage to David, who, after 20 years, decided not to build a Bellanca CE. David had done extensive research on the Bellanca CE and had amassed much information on the Bellanca.

Knowing that the Bellanca CE had been built in Hagerstown, Maryland, David contacted the Hagerstown Aviation Museum stating he had a 1919 Bel-

lanca CE fuselage in his hangar and wondered if the museum would be interested in having it for display. The museum had assumed that after nearly a century, no Bellanca CD or CE aircraft or parts still existed. Without the help of David Paule, this

rare artifact of aviation history would not have come home to Hagerstown. Along with the Bellanca CE fuselage, the museum also acquired an original Anzani six cylinder aircraft engine, reproduction propeller and David's large collection of Bellanca information.





The Bellanca CE fuselage is now on permanent loan from the Cradle of Aviation Museum to the Hagerstown Aviation Museum. This is the only major part of a Bellanca CE that is known to exist and may be the oldest surviving part of any Bellanca aircraft. The Hagerstown Aviation Museum plans to build full scale replicas of a Bellanca CD and CE in the future
