

Will do wet testing with fuel flow and useful fuel in about a week. Will start engine not long after that; in a month that starts with a J (hopefully not January). He also said Mark P. called him about a Young Eagles flight, so he called the kid's parents to arrange the flight. The Young Eagle arrives; he's 9 years old and a little over 3 feet tall. He had a cushion and a phone book, but the YE still couldn't see much. He explained the glass panel display, asked if he's played a flight simulator, the YE said he does every day, so the YE flew from north of Baltimore to Lancaster and back by using the displays (because he couldn't see). He has an oxygen/acetylene torch and a TIG welder if anyone cares to use it.
- Greg said he has a Cherokee 180 that has just been returned to flying condition. He flew up to Lancaster area, picked up his mother, and took her for her first ride since he earned his PPL. His mother was the one who started paying for his lessons back when he was about 15, so he enjoyed having a chance to take her for a flight.
- Chris provided a number of updates:
- WINGS flight review of the Leesburg airspace coming up check the flyer that Chris has (will also put info in the newsletter).
- Mary Ann has been wonderful and brought snacks to the meetings, but others are welcome to sign up to bring snacks.

"At 1:00 p.m., 17 March 1964, Joan Merriam Smith departed Oakland International Airport, on California's San Francisco Bay, on what would be the first leg of an around-the world flight. Her first stop would be Tucson, Arizona, approximately 650 nautical miles (1,200 kilometers) to the east-southeast.

Mrs. Smith intended to follow the easterly route of Amelia Earhart,"...

"... She began taking lessons at the age of 15. Joan learned to fly at the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical Institute, then located at at Tamiami Airport. She first soloed an airplane at the age of 16 years. On 7 November 1953, shortly after her 17th birthday, she was issued private pilot certificate. Special permission was obtained from the FAA for her to take the written exams for commercial pilot before she turned 18."


