- Possibility for outdoor picnic at (outside) Chapter hangar on April 17 at 2:00 p.m. Most of the board has gotten (or is in the process of receiving) their vaccinations. Steve Gross should have the RV-10 out of the hangar in March (It'll go for panel installation in early April), so there should be space. Everyone will bring their own food to keep risk of spreading COVID low.

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH: WOMEN IN AEROSPACE!

March is Women's History Month and is a time when we recognize the contributions of women in American history.

Through years of activism and an unwavering commitment to women, the National Women's History Project successfully lobbied Congress to recognize Women's History Month. The result was Public Law 100-9 on March 12, 1987. This law requested the president to issue a proclamation, which encouraged U.S. citizens to observe Women's History Month with appropriate observance activities. President Ronald Reagan then issued Presidential Proclamation 5619 proclaiming March 1987 as "Women's History Month" to honor the achievements of American women."

During wartime, women were vital in their roles of support and service as nurses, seamstresses, cooks and informants, alongside their male counterparts.

In 1948, Congress passed the Women's Armed Services Integration Act, which granted women the right to serve as permanent, regular members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and the recently formed Air Force

In 2020, recognition of the 75th Anniversary of World War II, the Department of Defense acknowledged the contributions and sacrifices made by service members, as well as those who served the home front.

About Me and My Experiences

"My name is Elizabeth L. Gardner, or for short, Libby Gardner. I am a pilot for the Women Aircraft Service Planes. a.k.a. WASP, which is considered a civil service. Before the war, I was a housewife and a mother who stayed home to take care of my family. I was called to duty when the war started to learn how to test planes, instruct pilots, tow targets used for anti-aircraft artillery practice, and assemble planes. I was grateful for the opportunity because it made my childhood dreams of flying and fascinations with planes a reality. I work 7 days out of the week and some of those days happen to be better than others. When I first started learning, I was eager and nervous and also had two days of training under Lieutenant Col. Paul Tibbets who later commanded the B-29 that dropped the first atom bomb on Hiroshima. The training consisted of three phases; primary, basic, and advanced. On the days that we have check rides, a lot of pressure can be put on us women, and we feel that we must make a name for ourselves in this industry. I had a check ride the other day, and I must say that things did not go so well for me that day. The man testing me was very quiet and sarcastic and did not give me much information or say a lot to let me know how I was doing. I would make mistakes as turning to far out or using too much rudder on the turns; I did my best to relax, but his sarcastic remarks did not make it easy and different items in my performance were still sloppy including my stalls. The only good thing that came from that test was my landing; it was possible that he would give me credit for that, but instead he stepped out of the airplane without saying a word about whether or not I passed. I held back my tears. The opportunity is wonderful, and I love doing this every day.

In this vintage photograph dated 1942/8/20 a man is affixing a radio antenna to a Fairchild XAT-13. Built by Hagerstown's own Fairchild Aircraft, the XAT-13 had a single machine gun in the nose, and a top turret with twin machine guns.

Founded in 1925 by Sherman Fairchild, Fairchild Aviation moved to Hagerstown in 1931. Prior to WorldWar II, Fairchild Aircraft was contracted by the United States government to take aerial photographic surveys of the US in order to track soil erosion. During World War II, Fairchild Aviation produced countless planes for the war effort. Today, the Hagerstown Aviation Museum seeks to preserve Hagerstown's rich aviation history. #flashbackFriday
