8 February 2022

Board Meeting

Tom Comeau, Chris Gunther, Larry Jarkey, Ernie O'Rourke, Mark Pankratz

7:10 pm Board meeting called to order by Chris Gunther.

- VMA and IMC meeting are still virtual and going well.
- Chris talked about an initial contact we have had from a homeschooling group that want to come to the Frederick Airport on May 27th. Chris responded to their email, but has not heard back about details. Stay tuned.
- March 3rd Chapter Gathering will be in person. Mark Pankratz has arrananged Buzz Carpenter to talk about the SR-71 Balckbird.
- It was discussed to have a Chapter picnic at the hangar on April 2nd with a rain date of April 9th. Mark Pankratz will look into the same company as last year (Canapes Catering) to provide food.
- Ernie indicated the the veterans' build continues to go well. They are discussing using an O-200 engine instead of the O-235 we have parts for, due to the extra weight (60lbs.), the custom engine mount needed for the O-235, and the lack of support for the O-235 from Zenith.
- There was discussion around the rainy day funds for the chapter running out in about a year. We have about 1/2 the dues paid as in a normal year, but Ernie expects that to get better when we are back to meeting in person. The Chapter's traditional means of fundraising (hosting Sportair Works shops and EAA aircraft tours) have been affected by the pandemic. Possible fundraisers we discussed were applying for hosting an Airventure pancake breakfast (applications open sometime in March) and restoring aircraft parts donated to the chapter and selling them. Ernie mentioned Chapter 36 in Hagerstown sells restored items. Chris will contact them to see how they do it. One item we might be able to sell is the empennage kit for the RV6 that was donated tot he chapter. Chris will inventory the box to see what we have. We also discussed hosting a local builders workshop, like we did several years ago.
- Ernie mentioned that Mark Gosselin is still intending to camp at Airventure and may host a chapter event during the week.
