Tom Crone has organized an intriguing-sounding program for May: Restoration of the Lenape Papoose-Powered (J-3P) Cub.





# **Notes from April Board Meeting**

Present for the meeting were: Mark Gosselin, Mark Pankratz, Ernie O'Roark, Joe Halleman, Doug Kelly, Jack Fromm, Tom Crone, Kris Crone, Tom Proctor.

- It was confirmed that there will be no July membership meeting since it would fall too close to July 4th.
- Doug Kelly gave an update on the EAA B-17 visit. EAA and AOPA have definitely agreed that the B-17 will be coming to Frederick for the weekend of October 4-5 as part of AOPA's Open House/75th Anniversary celebration. EAA has offered our Chapter the option of 'hosting' the bomber, much like we did for the Ford Tri-Motor, only this time, AOPA will do much of the heavy lifting as far as logistics and marketing go. The Board voted unanimously to participate. The Board members will serve as committee members and Doug said Dave Hirschman has agreed to serve as Chapter Liaison with AOPA. Mark mentioned that when he visited with Chapter 4 during their Ford Tri-Motor stop, they offered us the use of a custom trailer they have for pancake breakfasts. Mark inquired as to whether we wanted to take them up on that offer for the B-17 visit. Doug said he would rather find out what AOPA's plans were first as far as food service for the event. The Board agreed to postpone any response to Chapter 4 on the trailer pending Doug's findings on AOPA's plans.
- Mark informed the Board that, with its previous approval, he had purchased and installed a first-aid kit in the hangar. Cost was less than budgeted: \$64.
- Mark asked for approval to purchase picture frames (\$2/each from Wal-Mart) to prepare for an initiative he has in mind for displaying pictures of Chapter projects. It was approved.
- Mark also asked for approval to purchase a projection screen because of two current issues we have with presentations: 1) workshop instructors prefer to project on the east wall, but that is where Mark wants to mount the pictures, and 2) projecting on the removable door panels is not ideal either because of the noticeable seams and poor reflectivity. Instead of purchasing a new screen, Mark and Jack Fromm offered to investigate finding used screens at their places of employment.
- Mark only recently noticed a Chapter patch with our logo on a member's jacket. He did not know we ever had such a thing but liked it and wanted to resurrect the idea. Kris and Tom Crone said they might still have some of said patches in boxes at home and volunteered to look for them.
- Jack Fromm presented his findings on our application for 501(c)3 tax-exempt status for the Chapter. Charlie Becker had suggested that we work with Patti Arthur, an aviation lawyer who is EAA's official contact and resource for helping chapters obtain that status. Jack has been in touch with her and she offered us several options. The Board discussed the options and voted unanimously to contract with Patti to do the application for us. She has done this for many Chapters and the consensus was we had a much better chance for success in the least amount of time if she did it for us. The next step will be to set up an initial consultation session with Patti to see what's involved in creating the application. We will inform the Chapter when more details become available.

# **Plans for Former FCC Hangar**

Rodney Martz was kind enough to give us an update at the April meeting on AOPA's plans for the FCC hangar. He shared the following AOPA document with us and it is reprinted with his permission below.



### What is the "South Hangar Complex?"

You've probably heard the name "South Hangar Complex" thrown around lately, but maybe you're not sure what it is, or where it is. The South Hangar Complex is on airport property just down the road from headquarters. AOPA has been working on moving into the space for the past year and a half, and it seems it may soon be a reality.

The hangar building itself was built in 1965 and was used by Frederick Community College for its Aviation Maintenance program. After a few decades, the college stopped offering their airframe and powerplant mechanics course, leaving the building vacant for some time. Eventually, the county delegated the building to the fire department, who used it as a training site and a storage facility for equipment. Eventually, the FAA determined that a fire department staging area was not an aeronautical use of a building on airport property. The building once again sat vacant.

About 18 months ago, the city issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for an aviation operator who might be interested in leasing the building. AOPA began looking at moving into the hangar, but various circumstances delayed the process. This past November, AOPA again took a serious look and the airport showed an interest in AOPA occupying the hangar to create a public activity area — more than just a place to store aircraft.

They reissued the RFP, and AOPA responded. The lease agreement is now in the works.

"Assuming we are successful in finalizing the lease, our intent for the building is to operate it as an aviation community center; a welcoming place for non-pilots, community members, and families to come out on a weekend and be able to get up close and personal with airplanes, as opposed to being separated from them by a fence," explained Woody Cahall, vice president of Pilot Information and Flight Operations.

The hangar will be staffed with volunteers, and in addition to the community center, AOPA will host industry events, as well as offer it to other operators on the airport. It will also be a prime location for AOPA activities, such as photo shoots for publications, simulators, and a storage facility for AOPA's aircraft.

A lot of work will go into making the hangar complex a comfortable place for both employees and the community. If the lease is signed in the near future, a grand opening is anticipated for July 2014.


