## **Board Meeting Minutes**

12 May 2016

Meeting brought to order at 7:01 p.m. by Mark Gosselin.

Ford Tri-Motor update – They are still coming. Two people arriving Sunday, June 14. Hotel booked Sunday – Thursday morning. \$109.00 per night at FDK Holiday Inn. COIs were issued today and are in order. Plane will be stored in the AOPA NACC. Port-O-Let reserved Monday – Thursday. Erick is checking on 2 pop-up tents. Volunteers are sufficient. Mark is working on taxi diagram with airport manager and for the Tri-Motor's flightpath (to comply with noise abatement and avoid sensitive areas). Mark P. checking on lunch donation from Canapés. Ernie received check for \$250 from event donor. Signature is giving \$1 off per gallon of AvGas. Fifteen pre-registered ride tickets so far.

Joe going to send email to EAA Chapters in the area to generate more interest.

Steve Southworth will go along on the media flight on the Tri-Motor.

Mark proposed that we use 50/50 proceeds to be earmarked for scholarship money for a young, upcoming aviator and would like to get a review board of at least 3 people to help choose a recipient each year or every other year. The Ninety-Nines offered to add some of their scholarship money as well. This was unanimously approved by the board.

Ernie reported that we currently have 39 paid members. Cub engine completely disassembled. Jerry and Mike built a crate for crankshaft for shipping. Mike will make a similar crate for crank case. The fuselage tear-down began. Boot cowl, instrument panel, fuel tank have been removed. Meeting next Wednesday to continue work on fuselage and packing up the engine.

Mark G. suggested replacing all 10 ballasts (at \$20 each) in Chapter hangar.

Rex has names of instructors for workshops, but hasn't heard back since. He's expecting it'll be another week until we hear from Mark Forss about when he's shipping the box, etc. for Electrical Workshop, etc. He expected the brochures to have arrived by now, so he will contact Mark F. about that information. ## EAA Dynon STC

Charlie Becker, Director of Chapters, Communities and Homebuilt Community Manager, sent the following article to all Chapter newsletter editors and asked us to make sure all of our members heard about this exciting development. [Ed.]

#### EAA Partners with FAA, Dynon for STC Breakthrough to Upgrade Safety, Reduce Costs for Aircraft Owners

EAA, in partnership with Dynon Avionics and the FAA, has been awarded a Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) to install Dynon's EFIS-D10A in certain standard category aircraft. This breakthrough STC enables the inexpensive, but very capable, avionics that have served the experimental and light-sport worlds for decades to finally have a pathway into the type-certificated market. The Dynon system is a direct replacement for a vacuum-driven attitude indicator, and the STC currently applies to the Cessna 150, 152, and 172 series and the Piper PA-28 and PA-38 series. More aircraft are expected to be added soon.

EAA worked extensively with the FAA and Dynon to show compliance with regulations and develop a new certification pathway for safety-enhancing equipment. The long track record of the D10A product line and its conformity to a variety of industry standards helped it







become the first device accepted by the FAA in this pioneering effort. In addition to Dynon's proven reliability, the unit delivers a wealth of information to the pilot and even has an integrated angle of attack feature (with the installation of an optional probe). EAA installed the D10A in its 1976 Cessna 172M and submitted to a series of flight tests with an FAA test pilot, which went flawlessly.

EAA intends to begin selling the STC as soon as possible, hopefully later this spring, at a nominal price point in line with its existing autofuel STC. In addition to the D10A, more products are actively being explored as EAA is willing to work with other manufacturers to bring down costs and reduce barriers to recreational flying. Stay tuned for more details!


