Wings 'n Wheels

The weather on Saturday, May 5th turned out to be better than forecast for this year's Wings 'n Wheels and in spite of a few raindrops, AOPA reports that attendance was up 50% over last year. You can see a writeup, pictures and video on [AOPA's website](#).

Our Chapter was ably represented in both the wings and the wheels categories. Mark Panktraz had his exquisite RV-7A on static display and he filed the following report.

First, the photos below are from the Wings 'n Wheels event last May 5th. Turned out to be a perfect weather day. Nice shade from the overcast and perfect temps. The very occasional sprinkles really were no issue. The B-25 "Panchito" gave numerous rides and overall turnout was far more than most of us expected. Experimentals included my RV, Carlo Cilliers with his Mustang II and Bill Harrelson brought his Lancair IV that he used to overfly both the north and south poles, as well as fly non-stop from Guam to Jacksonville, FL. That dark gray thing two aircraft down from mine is Mike Filucci's TB30 "Epsilon," a French military trainer. Most of us will recognize Lynn Caywood's C-182 with the Air Race Classic markings. Another attention getter was the Howard that Dave Hirschman brought for Mark Baker. A beautiful high wing tail dragger with a radial engine. Tons of cars and motorcycles were also there. AOPA did a great job hosting, including food trucks and a live band. Just a great time.





And if you checked out AOPA's link, you'll know that Erick Webb not only brought his Honda CT70 motorcycle, but it also won a People's Choice award. Way to go, Erick! Erick shares the background on the bike below.

The motorcycle is a 1970 Honda CT70 trail bike. My grandparents bought it in 1970 from the original owner (who purchased it in October 1969, I believe) and my mom used to ride it when she was younger. It sat in a disintegrating shed for probably 20 years, then got moved to my grandmother's basement when the shed finally gave up. Last year, I asked her to sell it to me, but she just asked me to get it out of her house. I took it to Tri-State Motorcycle Service in Funkstown to get it running again. The only things not original to the bike are the tires and tubes, drive chain, carburetor, air box, right brake handle, battery, and the gas cap. Even the light bulb is original to the bike. Surprisingly, when I first brought it home, I put air in the tires and they held air even after 48 years. Everything functions as it should, so I took it to Wings 'n Wheels and parked it next to the Harley-Davidsons and Triumphs and somehow got the most votes for People's Choice. And no, it's not for sale.
