EAA Celebrates 70 Years of Sharing The Spirit of Aviation

EAA, organized with three dozen Milwaukee-area aviation enthusiasts on January 26, 1953, is celebrating its 70th anniversary with more than 270,000 members (the most ever) and 900 local chapters focused on growing participation in aviation by sharing The Spirit of Aviation.

"EAA's founder, the late Paul Poberezny, often said that he never expected this little Milwaukee airplane club to grow into what it has become, but it tapped into a basic aspiration — the freedom to fly," said Jack J. Pelton, EAA's CEO and Chairman of the Board. "For seven decades, EAA has allowed people to passionately pursue that dream with imagination and innovation, as they found kindred spirits that created an aviation movement that has no equal in the history of manned flight. It is an anniversary that we celebrate EAA as an achievement of the individual as part of a greater group that supports those efforts."

While the original founding group consisted primarily of those who built, restored, and modified their own aircraft, the organization soon encompassed people across all aviation interests — as Poberezny put it, "welcoming all who wished to participate." Over its 70 years, EAA enthusiastically welcomed those involved in flying, building, restoring, or simply enjoying flight on all levels.

Today, EAA provides programming to engage people of all ages with aviation, whether it is through resources from its headquarters in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, or from a local EAA chapter. In addition, the organization works to break down barriers to flight, whether those hurdles come from regulations or access to aviation.

EAA is also known worldwide for its annual fly-in convention, EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, which attracts more than 10,000 aircraft and a total attendance surpassing 600,000 to Oshkosh in late July each year. That event is the world's largest fly-in convention, with more than 5,000 volunteers welcoming visitors from more than 90 nations.

"While there are many associations one can join, EAA is among that unique set where members are significantly engaged and encouraged to participate, where aviation can grow on a local level," Pelton said. "That member-helping-member mindset has fueled the growth of the association throughout its history, and we're very excited about where the dreams of flight can take us in the future."







AIRPORT OF THE MONTH - WILLCOX




Willcox is a city in Cochise County, Arizona, United States. The city is located in the Sulphur Springs Valley, a flat and sparsely populated drainage basin dotted with seasonal lakes. The city is surrounded by Arizona's most prominent mountain ranges, including the Pinaleño Mountains and the Chiricahua Mountains.

Six of Arizona's ten largest mountains are located within a 70-mile radius including Mount Graham (31 miles north), which is Arizona's most prominent mountain, Chiricahua Peak (42 miles southeast), Mount Lemmon (57 miles west), Miller Peak (65 miles southwest), Mica Mountain (41 miles west), and Mount Wrightson (70 miles southwest). Scores of birds, including sandhill cranes, winter in the area, with some migrating from as far away as Siberia. A very large dry lakebed, the Willcox Playa, is located five miles south of the city. It is the remnant of the Ice Age-era Lake Cochise.


Willcox's high desert climate gives it large diurnal temperature variation, making it ideal for wine cultivation.

Cochise County Airport (IATA: CWX, FAA LID: P33) is a county-owned public-use airport in Cochise County, Arizona, United States. It is located 3.5 miles (3.0 nmi; 5.6 km) west of the central business district of Willcox, Arizona.^[1] This airport is included in the FAA's National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems for 2009–2013, which categorized it as a *general aviation* facility.^[2]

Facilities and aircraft [edit]

Cochise County Airport covers an area of 960 acres (390 ha) at an elevation of 4,187 feet (1,276 m) above mean sea level. It has one runway designated 3/21 with an asphalt surface measuring 6,095 by 75 feet (1,858 x 23 m).^[1]

For the 12-month period ending April 15, 2008, the airport had 8,500 aircraft operations, an average of 23 per day: 94% general aviation and 6% military. At that time there were 25 aircraft based at this airport: 96% single-engine and 4% helicopter.^[1]



Flying Legend, the manufacturer of the Tucano Replica (TR) Kit has just completed a contract with the Dominican Republic AF (FAD). FAD will use AF technical personnel to build out kits that evolved from the TR design. The Training and Patrol (TP) -75. The TP-75 is aerobatic rated at +6/-3 g' up to its 1650 lb MTOW. It features a Rotax 915iS, DUC 4-Blade hydraulic propeller. The wings are strengthened, the canopy is structurally supported front/rear and it sports a modified empennage from the TR.

The mission of Flying Legend at the outset of the company was to build economical aircraft for militaries around the world. The sale of the TP-75' marks the realization of that goal.

I have attached a rendering of the TP-75 (top) and the TR (bottom).

Once the tail was joined I could run the flight control cables. It took a little bit of work to make sure the cables were not crossed over each other, but the cables are not run. The stabilitor wires need to be adjusted so that stabilator stops limit the motion rather than the control stick stops, and need to be tensioned. The rudder cables are loose, no tensioning required, their length has been set correctly. I also installed the torque tubes for the flaperons. Since I had become reasonably adept at moving around in the baggage compartment and tail cone, I moved on to the aft window. I got it positioned & was waiting for it to get warm to drill the plexiglass, when a couple of 538 members helped me borrow an engine hoist and get it to my garage.

So I switched to the engine. The hoist legs were too narrow to fit around the crate - so I had to take the crate apart to lift the engine. The corner fasteners Rotax uses on their crates are a lot harder to get apart than Vans crates! Once lifted to a table, the only prep work was to mount the "suspension frame" to the engine, and re-route a couple of wires and radiator hoses to clear the frame. With a little help from a neighbor, the engine was hoisted into position and the bolts secured though the engine mounts. Next is to install the fuse box and engine control unit and connect the engine wire harness to the aircraft harness.

Vans support continues to impress me. I have had several times when I needed a part that was on the back-order list, and a phone call got the parts shipped that day. This time it was the master relay I needed for behind the engine. Unfortunately the post office lost the package for 5 days - so I had to mount and wire it with the engine installed. At least Vans did their part.
