PRESIDENTS MAY REPORT

Hello again members, family and friends of EAA Chapter 538 and a belated "Happy Mother's Day!" Another month has passed. (Where did the time go?) Summer is rapidly approaching and we prepare for rapidly warming temperatures. I already have had my first 100 degree day measured by the thermometer at the front porch of my house. As we know from this place in Arizona, this is the time when we generally move from outdoor activities to indoor ones. Right now, the mornings and evenings are still quite comfortable. I take every opportunity to enjoy the outside during these times.

Most people euphemistically call the necessary maintenance, upkeep and renovations of their home "The joys of home ownership." I recently completed the renovation of my workshop (with members help), a renovation within the house and then some last minute landscaping. After 4 and a half years of owning this place, I finally am able to fulfill the reason as to why I bought this place...work on airplane stuff. This is what I call "The real joys of home ownership."

I mentioned at last meeting that I had placed an order with Aircraft Spruce. This is supposed to be the materials to build the remaining two wings of the Starduster Project I recently acquired. I used up some left over plywood to make a jig to fashion the laminated wingtip bows. This was to be my first project once my materials arrived. Since the order still haven't arrived as planned, I decided to take up the next project. I planned to renovate previous work so I began to take a look at the upper wing center section. Upon giving it a critical review, I decided to remove the poorly done fiberglass wrapper the previous builder had applied. This exposed some other work aft of the rear spar that was not up to par. Since then I have reconditioned and reinstalled. Now I am working to remove all metal bits to have them stripped, etched and repainted. This should take the better part of the next month. I will also need to order the wing tank so I can fabricate the tank hold down straps and top cover. It is necessary to install the hold down straps before the leading edge and trailing edge sheathing can be installed to complete the project. I plan to have a short presentation ready should we have any vacancies in our presenter schedule.

Summer is the time where we plan the next years activities. We are expecting to have a pancake breakfast this fall and next spring. Also we usually participate in the Young Eagles event at the Stiller Airpark with another breakfast. Once certain restrictions are lifted, we can plan to have our own young eagles event as well. We are always looking for pilots and ground crews for these events. We don't have specific dates at this time, but we must move forward with the expectation that these events will happen.

Speaking of events, AirVenture is a go for this year as well as Sun 'n Fun. If anyone is planning to go, let us know. We would like to hear your stories of your adventures and of course, pictures. Help us out for those of us are not able to attend these events. Copperstate/Buckeye Air Fair, is in the planning stages. History

Henry Wickenburg

Grant's Stage Station, Wickenburg, 1873 or 1874

The Wickenburg area, along with much of the Southwest, became part of the United States by the <u>1848 treaty</u> that ended the <u>Mexican–American War</u>. The first extensive survey was conducted by Gila Rangers who were pursuing hostile Indians who had raided the <u>Butterfield Overland Mail</u> route and attacked miners at <u>Gila City</u>.

In 1862, a gold strike on the <u>Colorado River</u> near present-day <u>Yuma</u> brought American prospectors, who searched for minerals throughout central Arizona. Many of the geographic landmarks now bear the names of these pioneers, including the <u>Weaver Mountains</u>, named after mountain man Pauline Weaver, and <u>Peeples Valley</u>, named after a settler.

A German named <u>Henry Wickenburg</u> was one of the first prospectors. His efforts were rewarded with the discovery of the <u>Vulture Mine</u>, from which more than \$30 million worth of gold has been dug.[4]

Ranchers and farmers soon built homes along the fertile plain of the Hassayampa River. Together with the miners, they founded the town of Wickenburg in 1863. Wickenburg was also the home of Jack Swilling, who prospected in the Salt River Valley in 1867. Swilling conducted irrigation efforts in that area and helped ground the city of Phoenix, Arizona. Wickenburg was supplied from the Colorado River, by steamboat, then over the La Paz-Wikenburg Road by wagons and pack mules. Wickenburg in turn became a supply point for the mines and army posts in the interior of Arizona Territory.

As the town grew, conflicts developed with the <u>Yavapai Native American tribe</u>, who rejected a treaty signed by their chiefs, effectively breaking the treaty. When the <u>American Civil War</u> began in 1861, the Federal troops were all withdrawn and the settlements were left unprotected.

The Yavapai promptly began a series of attacks on the white townsmen. A company of <u>Confederate cavalry</u> brought temporary relief, but it fell back before the advance of <u>Union troops</u> from California. By 1869, an estimated 1000 Yavapai

and 400 settlers had been killed, with many on both sides fleeing to safer areas. With the end of the war, the Union troops and local volunteers forced the Yavapai onto a reservation, where they remain to this day.

However, Yavapai recalcitrant's remained for years, and raids on stage-coaches, isolated farm houses, and periodic raids on villages kept the area in a constant state of tension. Finally, following several murders of Yavapai chiefs allied with America by insurgent Yavapai warriors, hostile warrior tribal leaders mobilized the entire Yavapai warrior band into a massive assault on the primary American settlement of Wickenburg and massacred or drove out much of the American populace. In 1872, in response to the assassination of friendly Yavapai chiefs, the take-over of the entire Yavapai nation and its reservation by hostile elements, and with most of the American area under continual penetrating raids by Yavapai warrior bands, General George Crook began an all-out campaign against the Yavapai, with the aim of forcing the insurgent Yavapai warrior bands into a decisive battle and the removal of Yavapai settlers from American territory. After several months of forced marches, feints, and pitched skirmishes by combined Arizona territorial militia and US Army Cavalry, Crook forced the Yavapai bands into a single decisive battle. In December 1872, the Battle of Salt River Canyon in the Superstition Mountains decisively routed the Yavapai, and within a year most Yavapai resistance was crushed.

Having broken their treaty with America several times, with most of the friendly and allied chiefs killed by insurgent Yavapais, who also killed Americans, Crook was authorized to enter into new negotiations with the aim of reducing the size of the Yavapai reservation and removing it to an area more readily cordoned off from American communities and their communication lines. The surviving Yavapai warrior leaders grudgingly accepted the treaty which left the nation in far worse conditions than previously. They were compelled to surrender their firearms, move to the Fort Verde Reservation, accept a permanent Army garrison on their territory, accept direct administration by American Bureau of Indian Affairs agents and commissioners, have trade firmly emplaced in the hands of American government agents, and be regulated by an Indian Police force picked and trained by the US Army and later Arizona Territorial officers. After only two years on the Rio Verde Reservation, however, local officials grew concerned about the Yavapais' continued hostility, success, and self-sufficiency, so they persuaded the federal government to close their reservation and move all the Yavapai to the San Carlos Apache Indian Reservation.


The infant town of Wickenburg went through many trials and tribulations in its first decades, surviving the Indian Wars including repeating Indian raids, outlaws, mine closures, drought, and a disastrous flood in 1890 when the Walnut Creek Dam burst, killing nearly 70 residents. In spite of such challenging circumstances, the town continued to grow. Its prosperity was ensured with the coming of the railroad in 1895. In those years, the town had even once been viewed as a possible candidate for territorial capital. The historic train depot today houses the Wickenburg Chamber of Commerce and Visitor's Center. As of 2007, however, only freight trains pass through Wickenburg; passenger trains ended their runs in the 1960s.

Along the town's main historic district, early businesses built many structures that still form Wickenburg's downtown area. Tourism led to the development of <u>guest ranches</u>, with as many as 14 operating in the 1950s and 1960s, when Wickenburg billed itself as the "Dude Ranch Capital of the World,"[6] with development spurred by the construction of (<u>U.S. Route 60</u>). As of 2007, some of these ranches still offer their hospitality. Rancho de Los Caballeros is now a <u>golf resort</u>, while <u>Remuda</u> has been converted into the nation's largest eating disorder treatment facility and is now Wickenburg's largest employer. 



Hey Alex, you can refer them to n530mh.tumblr.com to get an update on the Jabiru Supercharger project. We've done extensive testing on the engine test stand and completed the updates on the computer control system. The test engine produced 137HP @2900 w/30.10 in Hg, 3 psi of boost (for MAP of 37). The d.a. was 2800' We are now in the process of installing a Rotec TBI, 40 mm on N530MH which will be the fuel delivery system for the flight tests. Although the Bing carb would handle the higher volume input, it required a high flow fuel pump and pressure regulator to accomplish that task, ergo we progressed to use of the throttle body injector. We will perform flight tests on the Rotec first to establish the baseline and then progress to installing the Rotrex Supercharger. Fortunately we aren't doing this on a Rotax engine...we' get lost in the R'. It looks promising to have a system that will produce 120HP up through 15000 msl.

Chapter Camping at AirVenture

Returning for AirVenture, chapters now have an affordable opportunity to establish a "beachhead" at which to base their activities. Rather than paying by the day, a campsite is staked out until the convention ends. Chapters are able to purchase in advance two to six campsites at a flat rate in order to establish a chapter base of operations. Since the campsites will be staked out in advance, each chapter can direct its members to camp in the vicinity of this area.

Request a Campsite

The following guidelines apply to this special opportunity:

- Chapters can secure two to six campsites for a special flat rate of \$252 per site. Additional sites may be acquired under the usual camping rules and pricing.
- 2. At least one camper per individual camping site credential must be a current chapter member and a current EAA member through the end of AirVenture Oshkosh. A list of EAA members to attend with the chapter (who must be current through the end of AirVenture Oshkosh) will be provided in writing to the camper registration staff with the chapter camping request form.
- 3. Offer excludes improved sites (water and electric) and sites in Paul's Woods, 101 Woods, handicap, and generator areas.
- Chapter camping is only available in Camp Scholler, aircraft camping is excluded from this offer.
- 5. EAA staff will stake out these campsites for the chapter beginning on or around Monday, July 5, 2021. Due to the camp ground already being open for weeks, chapter camp sites will be staked out as close as possible to the desired locations listed by the chapter.
- 6. No refunds due to early departure are allowed for these campsites.
- Chapters must comply with the policies and guidelines stated in EAA's current camping guidelines.
- 8. The chapter leader or chapter designee will manage all chapter camping credentials.
- 9. Potential updates are being considered in 2021 to provide campground credentials to the chapters by one of two methods, yet to be determined:
 - 1. A chapter designee for each chapter will arrive first and pick up the camping credentials for all chapter campers and be available to distribute them to their respective campers as they arrive. The chapter designee checking in the chapter must present the chapter camping confirmation form, which will be emailed to them after payment is processed by EAA.
 - 2. A chapter designee for each chapter will be mailed camping credentials for all chapter campers and distribute the credentials to their respective campers prior to arrival at Camp Scholler. The chapter designee will be mailed all credentials during the week of July 5, 2021 after payment is processed by EAA.
- 10. All sign ups and payments must be received by June 25, 2021.
- Chapters are not permitted to occupy their site until Saturday, July 10.



Basic sites are not marked or assigned. Once credential is issued, the member may locate and stake out an unoccupied spot in the campground. Individual basic campsites are not marked out but are to be sized to accommodate your camping unit and one transient vehicle with a 5' perimeter. Camping units must be a minimum of 10' apart. Any campsite deemed too excessive will be resized by EAA Security. All camping units and vehicles must be located behind the fire lanes. Fire lanes are marked as burn lines in grass or with signage. Camping credentials are not valid in EAA Public Parking Lots. Camping credentials must be visibly displayed on both on your camping unit and transient vehicle. Additional vehicle and visitor parking passes of the overflow (S Lot) may be purchased at the Camper Registration building. S Lot parking passes are not sold online. Camping credentials and campsites may not be transferred from one EAA member to another individual. Unused days calculated from the arrival date through the Monday after AirVenture, less a three-day minimum, may be refunded upon checkout. Any roped off unoccupied site without proper credentials will be Removed.


