
Time for Annual Banquet.

Bill Atkins retired from Northwest Airlines September 1, 1992 with Seniority #1 on a list of 5,556 pilots. Total hours in his log book are 33,197:34. Of this total 29,512:59 were as a pilot for NWA. Bill began flying in 1940. First aircraft a Piper Cub. In 1941 Bill joined the many individuals going on military duty. With his background he went into the Army Air Force and flew numerous types including B-17 and B-29.

On Dec. 10, 1945 Bill rejoined NWA with Seniority #307. He was checked out on the DC-3. During his years with NWA he flew the following; Martin 202, B-377 Stratocruiser, DC-4, DC-6, DC-7C, L-188 Electra, B-727, B-720B, B-320, DC-10 and B-747.

During these years Bill also invented and received original patent on the Wing-Tip Strobe Lights -1955. He also was on of the top ten (10) photographers in the World from 1974 - 1977.

Wild Bill is also an Astronomy Lecturer and Consultant.
