AEROBATIC CONTEST CATEGORIES

The following information was furnished by Loren Smith at the April chapter meeting.

Basic - Known Compulsory.

The competitor must fly a sequence of the four fundamental maneuvers, spin, loop, slow roll and steep turn.

Sportsman - Known Compulsory and Free Program
This category combines the fundamentals into a longer and more
complex sequence. There is also a Free Program which is designed by the contestant.

Intermediate - Known Compulsory, Unknown Program, and Free Program.

In addition to a more complex Known Compulsory and Unknown, the Intermediate pilot also is permitted to compose a Free Program or Free Style, of his/her own design. This program is subjected to certain restrictions in the rules.

Advanced - Known Compulsory, Free Program, and Unknown Program.

The Advanced pilot flies an even more complex Known Compulsory, a Free Program of his/her own design, and an Unknown Program which is handed to the pilot only hours before the flight and which the pilot is not permitted to practice. This is a test of the pilots ability to fly a group of maneuvers in a certain sequence which the pilot has not flown before. All category Unknowns operate on this same principle.

Unlimited - Known Compulsory, Free Program, Unknown Program and a 4 Minute Free Program.

The Unlimited pilot flies the most complex and difficult set of maneuvers of all competition pilots. He/she also must fly an extremely high-performance aircraft capable of flying the maneuvers which are required. The 4 Minute is often very exciting and entertaining.
