

Aviation Consumer Action Project - a Nader group, led the CAB to order airlines to exclude cost of advertising and lobbying from inclusion in their fare structure. \*\*Professional Air Traffic Controllers won a restraining order preventing FAA from reducing their hours because they admitted to having been treated for alcoholism, during their physical exams. Anderson-Greenwood Aviation Corp. advanced \$250,000 to Bellanca as part of their agreement whereby AG Corp will manage Bellanca's Alexandria operation through March '77. They still need to raise about \$5-million to get the ARIES-250, an all-metal high performance ship into production. Bellanca will manufacture and market the ARIES. \*\* A recent hearing in NEW RICHMOND produced some interesting figures during the discussion regarding upgrading the airport. The estimated operations at New Richmond Airport are 50 per day in the summer, 25 per day in the winter, the total yearly estimate ranging from 10 to 11 thous and operations.\*\* Bill Lear sold his Learstar 600 design to Canadair Ltd., then when they changed the design, Lear lambasted the modified model Canadair will produce!

"Hey there, which way to Ireland?" - 1977 is the 50th anniversary of Lindbergh's shouted question to the Irish fisherman, and his famous flight to Paris. The flight took 33 hours, 29 minutes at an average speed of 107.5 mph over a 3,600 mile course. Among other things affected by the flight, the stock of the Wright Aeronautical Corp. jumped from its typically inactive 29 34 to 34 36. The "Spirit of St. Louis" engine was a Wright Whirlwind. Lindbergh later became interested in conservation, invented medical and research equipment, and contributed heavily to research in those fields. He died at the age of 72 in Maui, Hawaii.
