Jim Brode was a Lt serving with the Office of Strategic Services, OSS, during WWII. Need for a method of flying light observation planes from unimproved land locations and ships, other than aircraft carriers, such as LST,'s. Jim designed a system that would allow observation aircraft such as L-2 and L-4 types to land and take off from a wire.

For LST installations two poles, or beams, were extended from the side of the ship. The distance between beams was about 300 ft.

A cable was extended between the beams with a cradle riding on the cable. From the cradle hung a loop that the aircraft hung from. The aircraft had a hook system sticking up above the aircraft. To take off the pilot climbed down a ladder, entered the aircraft, started the engine. When ready to take off a brake system held the aircraft in position until full power was developed. The brake was released and the aircraft accelerated down the cable. When the aircraft reached the end of the cable the pilot pulled a lanyard to release the hook supporting the aircraft. As the aircraft was only 50 ft. above the water and the ship was rocking in the ocean there was little spare altitude for the aircraft to settle down after release from the cable

The landing was a short field type approach. Full flaps, slow flight. The ship again was rolling which created a chailenge to the pilot to snag the cradle system. The cradle was braked to slow the aircraft to a stand still by the end of the cable.

LST 776 was used for this operation in the South Pacific. There was intention to develope an additional 22, or so, ships for this purpose. Fortunately the war ended prior to their need. John Tigman, Major, 77th Division was the CO of the liasion squadron chosen to train to operate from LST 776.

His introduction to the system was after receiving orders to meet with the Captain of LST 776 to discuss this new system. Prior to the meeting they had been sent directions and orders to install this, unknown purpose, hook system on aircraft. The Captain had no idea what was to happen. Eventually it was determined that the "Brode System" would be installed and used. It was up to John and his pilots to train themselves to take off and land.

They obviously did and used the method to launch liasion aircraft to spot Japaniese army instullations prior to the US Army landings on islands such as during the Okanawa attach.

Later pilots from the squadron trained an additional 200 pilots to operate from the system. There were no pilots or aircraft lost during training or operational conditions.

Jim Brode opened the program with a video showing testing of the system on a ship in the lower Missippii.
