The Midwest Antique Airplane Club is a group of enthusiasts that thoroughly enjoy antique airplanes. Although most members are from Wisconsin, Minnesota, Illinois, Iowa, and Michigan, there are members in nearly every state in the USA, and there are members in all countries where there is significant flying activity. They publish a monthly newsletter, and hold a meeting at a different airport each month. The May meeting is often held at Oshkosh, and includes a wonderful private guided tour of the EAA museum.

The biggest Midwest Antique Airplane Club meeting is in September, at Broadhead, WI. Broadhead is a hotbed of antique activity, and has three grass runways. Many airplanes at Broadhead have tailskids, almost all of the rest have tailwheels. The three day grassroots event at Broadhead is a great gathering

of real antiques, and is NOT open to the public.

To be a member of the Midwest Antique Airplane Club, you must first be a member of EAA Antique/Classic division, or a member of Bob Taylor's AAA organization. Dues are \$10.00 for the first year, which covers a directory of the 600+ members, a personalized plastic name tag, and twelve issues of the MAAC newsletter. Subsequent annual dues are \$5.00. Patches are available for \$2.00 each, and decals are \$.50 each. An extra name tag can be purchased (for a spouse or significant other) for \$5.00.

If you are interested in antique airplanes of any type, I heartily recommend that you join the Midwest Antique Airplane Club. I am sure that you will find people that share your interest. By joining the MAAC, you get a lot for very little. They accept cash donations (and often receive \$5.00 and \$10.00 donations at renewal time), which keeps the dues to a minimum.

Now your interested needs to be indicated. Please take the time to complete the following and send to Steve, or give it to him at the June meeting.


