October 4<sup>th</sup>, Doug setup a trip to Clare Municipal (48D) but were advised by Dan Schiffer that the airport was undergoing a restoration of its pad and there was no access to the terminal area. Doug changed our destination to Gladwin Zettel Memorial (GDW). They also have two courtesy cars available if more than 4 people show up. Doug sends out a text to a number of pilots and gets responses regarding how many are coming so we can plan ahead. It ended up that we would fly the yellow bird up as well as Bruce would fly his Cessna 172. Dan Schiffer also joined us and flew his R44 helicopter. Dan mentioned that he had experienced a 20-knot tail wind at about 500 feet above the ground. Doug flew up and we experienced a 25-knot tail wind at about 1500 feet above the ground. We were reading 140 knots from the GPS while indicating 115-knots on the airspeed gauge. Got there in record time. We signed out one of the courtesy cars and drove downtown to Maxes on Main. A good restaurant at reasonable prices. In order to get out of the car, you have to get one of the guys who ride in the front seat to open the door to the back seat. That is because the car is an old police car and has no handles to open the door from inside in back. So you got to be friends with the guys up front or starve! We all got different meals, but Bruce's was the most challenging. He ordered the club sandwich. When it arrived, we all watched to see how Bruce was going to handle it. With no exaggeration, the thing was at least 5 inches high. You would have to have an alligator mouth to take a bite of this sandwich. He had to peel off the first two pieces of bread to be able to eat it. After telling a whole bunch of lies to each

other and solving all the problems of the world, we headed back to the airport. It was my turn to fly back to Mason into the headwind. We took off on 27 and turned south and climbed to 2500 MSL. After leveling off, we noted that the airspeed was 115-knots indicated and the ground speed was 90-knots. To add insult to injury, it was also bumpy all the way back. About halfway back to Mason, the headwind relaxed a bit and we were getting 100-knots ground speed. All together a good flight and a great lunch.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of October, Doug organized a flight to Marshall (RMY) for lunch. Neither Doug nor I had been there in the past, but Mike mentioned to us that there was a restaurant within walking distance of the field. The group that showed up was Dan, Bruce, Mike, Tim, and of course Doug and me. The terminal there is really great and obviously relatively new. It had quite a few leather chairs that reclined for your comfort. Lots of glass looking out at the runway and approach areas. It has a small kitchen, a pilot's lounge with a computer system tuned to weather and large clean rest rooms. We didn't inquire about a courtesy car since the restaurant is a short walk directly behind the terminal building across the access road to the airport. The restaurant, The Emerald, is part of the golf course adjacent to the airport. The lunch menu was extensive and all the orders we received were quite good. No complaints! A place to come back to for a future lunch.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> of October, Doug organized a flight to South Haven (LWA) Regional for lunch. We have visited here for lunch in the past and looked forward to getting a lunch at the Chinese Buffet in town. We filled the ramp with airplanes! The group that showed up here was John and Connie, Dan, Bruce, Tim, and Doug and me= along with two new members to the group, Chuck Moore and his brother, Doug, from Texas who was visiting. Chuck flies an RV-12. Luckily, the courtesy car here is a van that holds 6 plus a pickup truck that holds 3. One more and we would be out of luck! In our great anticipation for Chinese, we happily set out to the restaurant. However, to our surprise, when we got there, we found the restaurant was closed on Mondays. Bummer!! So, John quickly got on his phone and found a restaurant just around the corner from us and we loaded up and headed out. The place looked like it had been there for a while, but we

invaded it anyhow. It was relatively small inside but had a table that would fit us all. Unfortunately, the were two guys sitting at that table. They graciously agreed to move to a smaller table, and we settled in, all 9 of us. The waitress warned us that there was only one cook on, and we may have to wait a little to get our food. This ended up being better than it looked; the food was very good. I ordered a hamburger (half pound of beef) rare but not cold and the cook hit it on the button. Very tasty! Of course, we all ate too much but I was lucky. It was Doug's turn to fly home. That means that I could get some shuteye. I must admit that he did find smooth air and a tail wind that put us back to Mason in record time. Again, another great lunch find. We will be back!


