#### And thanks again to Jack Martin for the donation!





LCC - MASON JEWETT CAMPUS

For this month's article I want to address how we are dealing with LCC's transition from an in-person college to one exclusively teaching online. Needless to say, both our students and our faculty have had to make a significant adjustment.

Our program normally presents material to our students in two separate but related methods. The first is the traditional classroom setting where the instructor lectures and the students take notes, ask questions and develop an understanding of the subject material. The second method is the hands-on portion of the program, which is conducted in the hangar. Students take the material covered in the classroom and apply it to practical exercises designed to reinforce subject mastery and comprehension of specific items. Over time, we have developed laboratory assignments designed to not only ensure student knowledge and skills achievement, but also to meet FAA requirements regarding levels of proficiency they have established for all our required leaning outcomes.

Up to now, this dual track teaching methodology has worked very well. Today, however, we have the "Stay Home, Stay Safe" environment in which we currently find ourselves. Due to the nature of our program, we have not taught online courses

previously. To their credit, the FAA at the national level recognized that aviation maintenance schools all over the country (176 in total) needed to move to online training to the maximum extent possible, and in mid-March published guidance for schools and their inspectors to use in developing an online training protocol so we didn't have to shut down completely.

Based on the FAA's guidance, we proposed a set of rules to follow so as to allow our instructors to teach as much of the course material as possible in an online format. Each school in the U.S. is assigned to FAA inspectors in the appropriate geographical region's FSDO office (ours are in Ypsilanti.) Our inspectors did a herculean job in reviewing and approving our proposal in basically 24 hours from time of submission, and we were pleased to announce to our students that as of Thursday, March 19 we were able to provide instruction online.

Our instructors have spent a great deal of time in recent days developing lessons students can take online. We are conducting online chats, video lectures and using other electronic content delivery methods. Obviously, hands-on laboratory exercises cannot be taught online, and those are reserved for when we return to in-person teaching. With the ability to teach online, we have significantly reduced time we need to spend in the classroom to prepare for the hands-on work, and our students are credited for the time they spend online reviewing each course's material.

Uncharted events have presented unique and difficult challenges. Student and faculty safety is paramount, and we all look forward to the time when we can return to our "normal" lives. What we are doing now in our program sets our students up for success when that day occurs.


