From EAA National; Chapter Gram; Sept. 2019 **EAA Young Eagles Credits Program Expands**EAA announced at AirVenture 2019 that the pilot requirement of achieving 10 Young Eagles flights before earning any Young Eagles credits has been removed. Starting with flights in 2019, all Young Eagles flights earn Young Eagles credits for the pilot's chapter of record.

The standard amount of \$5 per credit will remain. This means that any pilot who, for example, flies eight Young Eagles will earn eight credits (\$40 worth) for his or her local EAA chapter.

LCC - MASON JEWETT CAMPUS by Mark Bathurst (bathursm@star.lcc.edu)

LCC's Aviation Maintenance Technology program follows the college's semester schedule. As such, we start a new class every August, and our students graduate two years later, also in August. Our program has grown to the point that we have both a day and evening session, each with about 45 students enrolled. We are virtually at capacity based on classroom size, hangar space and teaching asset utilization.

One of the paradigm shifts we have experienced over the past few years is the strong demand for graduates from all facets of the aviation maintenance industry. Previously, graduates would have to seek out employers. Employers are now coming to us in significant numbers to talk to our students, all encouraging our graduates to work for them. Over the course of the two years our students are with us, over 20 employers will be here making presentations to our students and encouraging them to apply for a position as an A&P mechanic. Companies come from as far as San Francisco and as close as Battle

Creek. Every employer has the same message: Come work for us as soon as you graduate. Employers typically are from three major career fields. Airlines (both regional and major), MRO facilities (maintenance, repair and overhaul) and engine or aircraft manufacturers represent the majority of employment opportunities. FBOs at major airports have increasingly shown interest in hiring our students, and we are seeing interest from diverse companies such as helicopter operators and drone operators.

Of the class that graduated in August this year, 10% are working for engine manufacturers. 35% chose to work for MRO facilities, and 35% went to airlines. One graduate is working for a helicopter operator. The remaining graduates are finishing their FAA A&P licensure process or have chosen to finish either their Associates' or Bachelors' degrees before entering the workforce.

Of obvious interest to our students is the salary and benefit packages employers offer. Starting salaries range from approximately \$45,000 to \$60,000 per year, and this is before overtime, profit sharing, bonuses and shift differentials. Employers are now offering relocation allowances, customized complete tool boxes, tuition reimbursement and a full package of benefits including health insurance, 401K match and the like.

When we talk to prospective students, we ask them what brought them to consider aviation maintenance as a career. To a person, they indicate that this is where well-paying jobs are, and the opportunities for advancement, both professionally and financially, have never been better. We expect this to continue for the foreseeable future.
