"I have a phone number for you to call when you are on the ground. Advise when ready to copy". These are words no Pilot wants to hear! "You Can Call Me Bravo, Buster" presented by Laura Hermann P/ASEL- IR, AGI, Remote Pilot, Lead FASTeam Representative. Join Laura as she describes her inadvertent foray into O'Hara's Class Bravo and the events that followed. She also will talk about her flight around the DC SFRA, what kind of training is involved, and answer the questions: What is The Fluky Gate?, Why is Leesburg Airport special?, and how are P 56 and R-6608A different? Join us for a tour around some challenging and difficult airspace! Laura is a 1500 hour instrument rated Private Pilot with high performance, complex, and tailwheel endorsements, who learned to fly in 2000 after completing a graduate program in nurse anesthesia. She also is an Advanced Ground Instructor and is adjunct faculty at the University of Minnesota Mankato, Department of Aviation. One of her aviation goals is to land a Cessna in all 50 states. All she has left us Idaho in Hawaii! Idaho will happen in June and Hawaii at some point in the near future. Laura flies a Cessna 182 and it's based at Flying Cloud Airport. Laura's other passion besides flying for the \$200 hamburger is to rescue animals from overcrowded shelters and fly them to foster homes or forever families. She has flown over 200 dogs, one cat, and two goats. One flight involved two Great Danes in the back of her 182! Laura is also a leading FAASTeam representative and was named 2022 national FAA Safety Team Representative of the year. She is also the 2022 Flying Cloud Operator of the year. Along with volunteering for the FAASTeam, Laura is a member of the Minnesota 99s (women pilots), MSP Airport Watch, and EAA Chapter 878. We are honored to have Laura present at our EAA Chapter meeting! WINGS credit is available for this presentation.

Aspiring aviators will have the opportunity to discover multiple pathways to becoming a pilot as EAA presents its inaugural Learn to Fly Week on May 15-20.

Beginning May 15th, expert flight instructors and representatives from various aviation organizations will present free, interactive webinars. These webinars will cover topics from starting flight training, saving time and money in flight training, preparing for the FAA written exam, to passing the checkride, and so much more. While the live showing of these presentations will be open to the public, the recordings will be archived for EAA members to view at their convenience.

Learn to Fly Week will conclude on Saturday, May 20, with Flying Start events hosted at chapters across the country. EAA's Flying Start program allows EAA chapters to welcome, encourage, and educate new aviation enthusiasts about the fun, freedom, and accessibility of personal aviation in their local area. Following a short presentation about learning to fly, attendees will be offered a free introductory Eagle Flight to experience the spirit of aviation firsthand.

"Becoming a pilot is a dream for many, but few know where to start their journey. Learn to Fly Week was created to help encourage aspiring pilots to take action and begin the pilot training process," said David Leiting, EAA Eagles Program Manager. "Our goal is to show attendees how accessible achieving their dream actually is." Leiting also added that inspiration from this event stemmed from packed forums at the Learn to Fly Center at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022, as well as the success of other EAA virtual events like Homebuilders Week and Virtual Ultralight Days.

Combining the educational forums from the Learn to Fly Center and the connections and inspiration found at Flying Start events, EAA Learn to Fly Week is the latest effort in the ongoing effort to help aspiring pilots achieve their dream of flight.

Did you know that you pilots can still give Young Eagle flights (free flights to youth ages 8-17 years old) even when there is not a Young Eagle Rally? Pilots can find all of the information at https://www.eaa.org/eaa/youth/free-ye-flights/ye-volunteers/ye-volunteer-opportunities/eaa-young-eagles-volunteer-pilots

Young Eagle forms, Certificates of Young Eagles Flight, and Sporty's Log Book with access code to the Sporty's Online Ground School Program (\$249 value) are available to pilots to the right as you enter the Aero Club Board Room (Kitchen area).

The Young Eagle form to be completed in its entirety prior to flight, including parent/guardian signature.

Pilots who are in compliance with giving Young Eagle flights and with each fully completed Young Eagles form, EAA Chapter 551 will be given \$5 in Young Eagle credits for each flight.
