YOUNG EAGLE FLIGHTS

Did you know that you pilots can still give Young Eagle flights (free flights to youth ages 8-17 years old) even when there is not a Young Eagle Rally? Pilots can find all of the information at https://www.eaa.org/eaa/youth/free-ye-flights/ye-volunteer-ye-volunteer-pilots

Young Eagle forms, Certificates of Young Eagles Flight, and Sporty's Log Book with access code to the Sporty's Online Ground School Program (\$249 value) are available to pilots to the right as you enter the Aero Club Board Room (Kitchen area).

The Young Eagle form to be completed in its entirety prior to flight, including parent/guardian signature.

Be sure to turn in your completed (flights given) Young Eagle forms. There is a file drawer below the TV in the EAA Chapter 551 Board Room marked for this. Pilots who are in compliance with giving Young Eagle flights and with each fully completed Young Eagles form, EAA Chapter 551 will be given \$5 in Young Eagle credits for each flight. EAA Chapter 551 can then spend those funds on items to support future Young Eagles Programs.

EAA 551 Board Meeting

EAA 551 Board Meeting Minutes

January 2, 2024

Called to order at 6:30 pm by Rob Jahnke

Present were Kathy Warzecha, Bill Justin, Dale Field, Ken Olson, Steve Anderson, Rob Jahnke, Chip Sauers, Greg Bednark, and guest Keegan Eibensteine

Rob reviewed member and chapter appointment list, and list of ex officio board members and list of programs for 2024 currently scheduled.

December minutes were presented. Motion to approve by Bill, seconded by Chip, passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report was presented by Ken.

Webmaster report.

Rob Jahnke reported Wifi update. Currently we are accessing WiFi from St Cloud Aviation from their guest privileges. Rob to inform them of the circumstance and get approvale from Bill to continue to do so.

Newsletter report.

Nothing to report

Old Business.

Since there was no election of President, First Vice President and Second Vice President at the November meeting, the by-laws state that the board of directors shall fill the empty positions. Rob Jahnke has agreed to serve as president for 2024, Kathy Warzecha has agreed to serve as First Vice President, and Bill Justin has agreed to be an activities director. This slate of officers was presented. Motion to accept this slate of officers was made by Ken, seconded by Dale, and passed unanimously.

Christmas Party review.

The members had received good comments about the move to the afternoon time. Ideas about possible entertainment for the future were presented. A reminder to recognize in the future the service by board members, officers and Young Eagle volunteers was noted.

Dues update.

The board had approved in May an increase in dues to \$30 by members, \$40 for family, and to keep student membership at \$10. It was noted that this needs to be voted on by the members. This will be an action item for the January membership meeting.

Committee members.

Rob presented a list of the various committees of EAA chapter 551. These members are volunteers and are not required to be voted on by the membership. A motion was made by Ken, seconded by Kathy to approve the slate of committee members. Passed unanimously.

Ray Scholarship update.

Our current scholar, Duncan Sauers, is still in training. We have expended the \$10,000 that was the amount of the EAA scholarship. Duncan will be responsible for the further costs of training. He has expressed the desire to complete his training.

There are two scholarship programs offered by EAA: the first is an \$11,000 scholarship that is applied for by chapters and is awarded in February or March. Applications by the chapters for this scholarship is due to EAA by January 31. There is no guarantee that we will be successful, but we have had four successful candidates in the last 6 years. The second is a scholarship, whereby the chapter is responsible for raising 25% or \$2,750, with EAA provided funding for the remaining \$8,250. EAA has expressed that if the chapter has had one successful candidate in the past that a slot for 2024 was assured. This application was submitted by Ken by December 31, which was the due date of the application. The chapter had initiated a scholarship fund with the Initiative Foundation in Little Falls several years ago (pre-pandemic). Ken had inquired about the status of this fund in December and verified that the balance in the fund was \$4,980. He also inquired about the potential of using this fund for our Ray Aviation scholars. They informed him that if a grant was applied for to use these funds, that they would send the money back to the chapter, since their minimum to maintain the fund is \$20,000.

A motion was made by Kathy, seconded by Bill to apply to the Initiative Foundation for a grant in the amount of the balance to be used for future Ray Scholars. Passed unanimously.

Garbage detail

Concerns about cleaning the premises after board and general membership meetings were discussed. The need to make the cleanup a priority in the future was emphasized.

Young Eagles Details

Dates for the young eagles events in 2024 were discussed, noting that in 2023 our event coincided with the Great Minnesota Gathering in Buffalo. Also the potential of an event in Little Falls during Dam Days was

raised, if the Little Falls chapter did not hold an event there this summer. The fall event in September was also discussed.

Rob has done research on our past chapter policy of paying the FBO directly for some of the fuel consumed by the pilots at Young Eagles events does not meet FAA or EAA approval, so in the future our chapter is precluded from providing this benefit. Our future events will have no monetary participation by the chapter. Since this is not a task, act or responsibility of the chapter, no motion was made or needed.

Air Academy

Cost and levels of involvement in EAA's various air academies were discussed. The academy's opportunities for attendance by youth for 2024 are already filled. The chapter needs to keep this in mind going forward.

Flight Simulator

Usage of the flight simulator was discussed. It was agreed that the simulator is for the use by any EAA member. A meeting will need to be held with those using the simulator for training, with a system of impressing on those using the simulator that they need to be members of EAA 551 to continue to do so.

Spending Limits and authorization resolution

A resolution to give authority to the treasurer to pay ongoing bills of the chapter in an amount not to exceed \$500 was presented. Motion made by Dale, seconded by Chip to accept such resolution. Passed unanimously.

Meal Planning

In the past, the board members had agreed to each be responsible for arranging for the meal for one month...that they didn't have to do the work, but make sure that something was planned, both for the board meeting and the membership meeting. Ken volunteered to make sure we had enough chili for the January membership meeting. He also volunteered to take care of the February meetings, and to get ideas from the rest of the board for upcoming meetings.

The February board meeting will be held on February 13, and the general membership meeting on February 20.

Motion to adjourn by Dale, seconded by Bill, passed unanimously.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15 pm
