

We will once again be using Online Registration for our Young Eagle Rallies and hope to have the ability to capture electronic signatures eliminating the need for paper forms! Watch our Facebook page for details!

In 2021 we implemented a number of COVID-19 safety precautions for our Young Eagle Rallies including:

- Online registrations
- All Young Eagles wearing masks while inside the aircraft regardless of vaccine status
- Hand sanitizer before entering the aircraft
- Temperature check prior to flight

At the beginning of 2022, Illinois has reported 2,589,640 total COVID cases, including 29,099 deaths in the state since the pandemic began. The statewide test positivity rate was 15.6%. According to the CDC, the latest variant - Omicron - can spread the virus to others, even if they are vaccinated or don't have symptoms. While fewer people seem to be hospitalized with Omicron, experts seem to agree that this will likely not be the last strain of the COVID virus. Since safety is our top priority we will evaluate the current state of the virus as we get closer to Young Eagle season and proceed accordingly.



'Pilot Your Own Adventure' Contest Returns



The opportunity for an EAA AirVenture Oshkosh once-in-a-lifetime camping experience is the grand prize as EAA's Pilot Your Own Adventure contest, supported by Flight Outfitters, is now open for pilots and aircraft owners. In 2022, the contest welcomes those to submit original, true-life stories behind the aircraft they have owned or currently own.

Aviators can enter by writing 500 to 1,000 words about that aircraft. The entry submission must be non-fiction, based on real facts, real events, and real people, and also adhere to the contest requirements as outlined in the official contest rules. Entries must be

accompanied by two to eight photos with captions of up to 30 words each.

The contest opens on January 14, 2022, and closes on March 14, 2022. Entries can be submitted either online or via the mail. Along with the camping experience at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022 in a fully branded Flight Outfitters camper, the grand prize winner will receive a bounty of Flight Outfitters clothing and gear. EAA Virtual Ultralight Days Coming February 22-24



Experts from throughout the ultralight community will share their knowledge to those engaged in the lighter side of recreational aviation on February 22-24, as the inaugural EAA Virtual Ultralight Days hosts webinars open to all at no charge.

The 15 total webinars — five on each of the three days — are based on the highly successful format used during EAA Homebuilders Week and EAA's popular webinar series. The live sessions will be hosted by well-known subject matter experts in the ultralight community, with question-and-answer periods to address specific questions.

"As we celebrate the 40th anniversary of the FAA Part 103 regulations that created the modern ultralight movement, EAA Virtual Ultralight Days is a way to make our community stronger, safer, and more fun," said EAA Ultralight and Light Plane Community Manager Timm Bogenhagen. "This three-day event connects well with EAA's mission to grow participation in aviation by sharing The Spirit of Aviation, inviting everyone to learn and develop their own skills and knowledge." Topics covered will include how to get started in ultralights; how-to instructions on a variety of ultralight aircraft like gyroplanes, powered parachutes, and trikes; and overall informative topics on maintenance, airport operations, safety inspections, and more.

All sessions are free of charge to everyone, with the archived presentations available to EAA members afterward. Pre-registration is encouraged, with registration links and additional schedule information available at EAA.org/UltralightDays.

Speed records set by electric aircraft

Two speed records set by British pilots Phill O'Dell and Steve Jones in the electric powered aircraft "Spirit of Innovation" have been ratified by the <u>Fédération Aéronautique Internationale</u> (FAI), The World Air Sports Federation.

The first record was set by Steve Jones, who reached a speed of 330 mph over a 9.3 miles course at the UK government's experimental aircraft test site, Boscombe Down, on Nov. 11, 2021.



Following this achievement, Phill O'Dell took to the controls of the "Spirit of Innovation" to reach an impressive 345 mph over a set course of 1.86, beating the existing record in the category.

Schaumburg changing aviation services provider at airport for first time



Schaumburg Regional Airport has selected Iowa-based Carver Aero as its new fixed base operator, after Northwest Flyers ended its service there at the end of 2021. Carver Aero has a five-year contract at the airport beginning Feb. 1 and will provide services such as aircraft engine and airframe maintenance and repair, fuel and aircraft sales and flight training.

Carver Aero acquired LumanAir Aviation Services at Aurora Municipal Airport last August and Janesville Jet Center at the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport in Janesville, WI last July.



\$1.6 million in state funding coming for Aurora Municipal Airport upgrades

The Aurora Municipal Airport in the 42nd District, represented by State Senator Linda Holmes (D-Aurora), will receive much-needed upgrades thanks to nearly \$1.6 million in state funding.

"As Aurora continues to grow, our transportation hubs must be up to par to serve our economy," Holmes said. "The airport provides good-paying jobs to area residents, and lets local businesses and industries move their people and products in a safe and efficient manner."

The funding is provided through the bipartisan Rebuild Illinois capital program, and designates a total of \$94 million for 96 airport projects in urban and rural communities across the state. Projects will include planning, construction, reconstruction, development and improvement of public airports to increase safety and efficiency. Communities also will benefit from increased aviation access, good-paying jobs during construction and long-term opportunities for workforce expansion.

Aurora Municipal Airport will receive \$1.3 million to rehabilitate parking lots and the entrance road, and \$279,000 to overlay perimeter roadways.

"I'm excited to see how these improvements will help Aurora's future economy and job market by attracting more business," Holmes said. "These grants allow smaller airports in our state to make much-needed repairs and modernize their facilities."

National Warplane Museum

Geneseo, New York

Founded in 1994 on the grounds of the Geneseo Airport, the museum is dedicated to preservation, flying, and restoration of aircraft from World War II to Vietnam eras. The museum is also host to the annual Geneseo Air Show each summer which is one of the most highly rated airshows in the country.

Also on display are vehicles including the DUKW "Duck" Amphibious vehicle, a military 1934 Plymouth, and an SS Cycle with sidecar. Among the displays/exhibits are a replica briefing room, Tuskegee Airman Exhibit, and an extensive display of uniforms and model planes. One unique display is "America at Home" which recreates 4 rooms (Kitchen, Living Room Dining Room and Utility Room) of a typical home in the 1940's

The museum also has a gift shop.




