#### FAA Launches Nationwide Solicitation to Design Air Traffic Control Towers of the Future



The FAA is launching a nationwide solicitation to find a new design for control towers that can be built and operated sustainably at regional and municipal airports.

The FAA has more than 100 aging control towers at regional and municipal airports across the United States that will eventually need to be replaced. The goal of the nationwide solicitation is to develop a standardized design for towers that will:

- Meet operational and cost requirements
- Maximize energy efficiency
- Be easy to modify according to height needs
- Be rapidly constructed

On Nov. 9, the FAA will host a webinar to answer questions from interested businesses before the official solicitation starts. The registration opening for U.S.-based architectural and engineering design firms is scheduled for Nov. 16.

## **Ken's Aviation Museum of the Month**

## Yankee Air Museum Willow Run Airport, Belleville MI

Located at historic Willow Run Airport, home of he Ford B-24 Liberator plant. The Yankee Air Museum has a storied past and exciting future. Established in 1981, and housed in a World War 2 hangar, the museum had a comprehensive collection of aircraft both static and flying along with an amazing display of artifacts and memorabilia on the second floor.

In October 2004, the hangar caught fire. The 3 flying aircraft (B-17, B-25, C-47) were saved by volunteers who smelled smoke when they were closing the hangar. With the exception of these 3 planes everything in the hangar was



reduced to ash in a matter of an hour or two as the hangar was constructed from wood. Sadly lost was a newly restored, one of a kind OV-10 Bronco Prototype.



The museum chose to rebuild and rented out several buildings on the airport property to start a new collection and house other aircraft they had in their collection that were not affected by the fire.

in 2016, the museum purchased a portion off the old Ford B-24 plant and is currently renovating it to be the new permanent museum. in 2011 the museum became a Smithsonian affiliate.

Flying aircraft owned by the museum include a B-17, B-25, C-47, Waco -YMF, UH-1 Huey and Ford Tri Motor.

Static aircraft include a B-52 Stratofortress, BP4Y- Privateer, Cessna O2 Skymaster, F101- Voodoo, F86 Sabre, F-4 Phantom, EC-14 Warning Star among a number of others.

The museum building has displays and special exhibits along with lectures and special presentations, including open cockpit days. Yankee Air Museum also hosts one of the best airshows in the country "Thunder Over Michigan" at Willow Run each summer.

#### Kenosha Brat And Beer Run

We were seated in a section of the establishment not too far from a stage, where a small jazz band was setting up for some evening music. Our route was fairly direct, contacting Kenosha Tower after getting their local ATIS information. Kenosha directed us to land on 7R, which is the shortest and skinniest runway, but Peter settled us down with a graceful center-line landing.

Twilight was just underway at Kenosha when we disembarked from the Warrior at AVP Kenosha Aviation, one of the FBOs on field. AVP offers arrivals the use of a nice VW SUV courtesy car,

Since the tower was closed, we announced that we would depart on 7L. From there it was a nice smooth nighttime flight, pretty much direct, back to DPA, where ATC directed us to land on runway 2L.

## **Ask Professor Green**

#### Question:

What is a VFR?

#### **Answer:**

VOR or VHF Omnidirectional Range is a short-range radio navigation system enabling aircraft with a receiving unit to determine its position and stay on course by receiving signals transmitted by a network of fixed ground radio beacons.



Developed in the US in 1937 and deployed by 1946, VOR was the standard air navigational system in the world, however due to GPS, VOR stations are being gradually decommissioned from a total of 3,000 worldwide.

The US system had a total of 1,033. The FAA is in progress to shut down many unnecessary VOR's ending up with a Minimum Operational Network (MON). Eighty-two are already gone with 225 more that have been identified, for a total of 307 that will be decommissioned by 2030.

Here are the MON high points:

- Retain for coverage at 5,000' AGL and above across the entire CONUS
- Retain VORs to perform ILS, Localizer or VOR approaches within 100 NM of any location in the CONUS
- Retain most VORs in the Western US Mountainous Area for Victor airways in high elevation terrain
- Retain VORs required for military use
- Retain VORs to support international oceanic arrival routes




