At this time, Don called upon Kristen Esquivel to present her impressions of a 1<sup>st</sup> timer at Airventure in Oshkosh. Byron also spoke about some of the things he and Kristen experienced on the trip and the latest trip he took to Mineola, TX for the 40<sup>th</sup> Corvair College presented by William Wynne and Dan Weseman (of Panther fame). There were about 40 participants and most were either ready to test run their engines, working on the conversion, or just there to learn about them. Corvair engines have been converted for aircraft use since they first came out in 1960 and continue to this day (albeit the conversions now are MUCH improved over the early ones). There are hundreds flying and they range in horsepower from 65 to 130 and more. Some are turbocharged and can fly in the upper atmosphere with some airliners, but most are flying where most of us fly: 1000 to 12000 feet.

Robert spoke about some of the problems he's had dealing with the website and has found a way around most of the problems by putting a link to another page, instead of trying to make changes to the original one that EAA provides. Don also mentioned that there are a lot of things that can be achieved with the chapter Facebook page as well.



Ted Miller spoke about a new thing he's been trying: he's joined the Sport Air Racing League (SARL) and that he participated in his 1<sup>st</sup> race last weekend in Galveston and WON HIS CLASS at a speed of (gasp!) 195.87 mph!!!!
