May Chapter Meeting Minutes

The Treasurer's report and minutes from the April meeting were accepted as published in the last newsletter.

Progress of the meeting room was discussed.

- The Back wall has been framed and the metal arrives Thursday (9 May). Intend to put up the metal next week.
- Mike Lotz is almost done with the electrical wiring.
- A check list has been established for the remaining work.
- Two new board members were appointed, Alan Bane and Amber Aanstad and responsibilities for specific work has been assigned to board members to divide up the project.
 - o Amber is the membership committee chairperson and is in charge of painting.
 - o Alan will be running drywall crew.
 - o Paul Visk is doing the stairs, the outside deck and the security system. Security camera are already in place.
 - o Jim Schaefer will be in charge of cabinetry, trim work and audiovisual. Part of the cabinetry will be to use some of the available wood to build workbenches for the hangar.
 - o Mike Lotz has the electrical and HVAC system.
 - o John Schaefer will work the framing & insulation. The plan is to finish framing Thursday for the metal and the rear door.
- We have spent \sim \$9000.00 so far and estimate another \$3k \sim 4k for the drywall and the HVAC system.

CHAPTER 64 YOUNG EAGLE EVENTS ON THE SCHEDULE

(Additional Events May Be Added)

SATURDAY, JUNE 8th: Columbia Sackman Field Open House and Fly-in has been postponed until August 17th due to soggy field conditions. See event details below.

SATURDAY, JUNE 15th: Not a Young Eagle event and no ground volunteers are needed, but Chapter pilots are invited to fly-in to the Millstadt Flight Park (1IL4) Saturday afternoon. Bob will be hosting the Gateway Miata Club's annual family picnic at the Flight Park. They will be interested in seeing your planes and taking a ride if you're willing to give them a short flight. Free food and drink for all fly-in guests. That's also the Flying Dutchman's Pancake Day and Sullivan Field's Lunch Fly-in, so spend the morning at the Dutchman and Sullivan and then drop into Millstadt during the afternoon.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 26th: We will be flying approximately a dozen 8th graders attending Belleville's Harmony School STEM Aviation Camp. We'll need 2-4 aircraft and a handful of ground volunteers to support this small group. Please arrive for a 9 a.m. briefing to begin flying at 9:30.

SATURDAY, JUNE 29th: St. Louis Downtown Airport's west ramp community will be holding a youth flying event and barbecue from 11-2 and our Chapter will be providing Young Eagle flights. Unlike most of our Young Eagle events, we do not have a specific group planned and all our Young Eagles will be walk-ins, so we won't know how many will show up. We'll hold our volunteer briefing at the Museum at 10:30, so arrive earlier to be ready. The 99s (Women's Pilots Association) and Big River Aviation will be sponsoring and preparing the food. Tuskegee Airmen Inc. will have a speaker and an actual Tuskegee Airmen who served in WWII has been invited for the event! The American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics will be participating and the Organization of Black Airline Pilots and SWIC aviation students have been invited. There's even a possibility of having other exhibitors such as an antique car club and a Model-T club.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 17th: Chapter 64 will provide Young Eagle flights for the Columbia Sackman Field Open House and Fly-in. We plan to fly between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. If you can't stay all day, we can use the help whenever you can. Volunteers should arrive by 9. We'll have a safety briefing at 9:30 to cover the planned route and ground safety procedures. If you arrive later for perhaps only the afternoon, we'll be sure you receive the briefing before flying.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 14th: We'll go on the road again to fly Young Eagles at Sparta's annual Open House and Fly-in. This will be another all-day fun event. Times and other details will be available as it gets closer to the event.

NEW YOUNG EAGLES ON-LINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM

It's up and running and works great!

Our Chapter participated in testing a prototype on-line system for registering Young Eagles last year. EAA attempted to modify a generic commercial on-line event registration system to meet Young Eagles requirements, but it was a massive failure. It was cumbersome and confusing for the registrants and the Young Eagles coordinators.

They learned from their mistakes and have launched a new on-line Young Eagles system designed specifically and only for Young Eagles events. It's very nicely done, fairly simple to use, greatly simplifies the process, and is being implemented worldwide. It is even designed for use when a single pilot flies a single Young Eagle on his or her own. (Each pilot will receive their own personal and private webpage with a simple URL for those individual flights. The old paper system can still be used, but the new on-line system has many advantages and should be used, if possible.)

All Young Eagle pilots and volunteers SHOULD register and use the system.

Registering will ensure you receive notifications for all our Young Eagle events, to include event changes when an event must be rescheduled due to weather. To register:

- 1. Go to yeday.org
- 2. Click on "Sign Up" in the upper right-hand corner.
- 3. Enter your information on the next page. For "Function," please select "Young Eagle Pilot" if you fly Young Eagles or "Volunteer" if you are a ground volunteer. (NOTE: Because this is a brand new website that asks for personal information, some antivirus software programs may give you a warning that the site may not be safe. IT IS SAFE. Continue to the site and enter your information.)
 - a. Be sure to list EAA 64 as your chapter. By doing that, all our scheduled Chapter Young Eagle events will appear when you log on.
 - b. Individuals who have not yet joined EAA or our Chapter can also sign up as a Volunteer. You do NOT have to be a member to access the site or be a volunteer.
 - c. Pilots: If you upload a scanned or photographed image of your signature, it can be preprinted on Young Eagle Certificates.
- 4. After you sign up, you can log in and you will see all Chapter 64 scheduled Young Eagle events on your main page.
- 5. See the event details by clicking on the Event Title.

By registering, we will be able to match pilots to Young Eagle registrants and automatically generate and transmit an event report to EAA HQ. You will then receive credit and the flight will be entered into EAA's giant logbook within 24 hours or less.

It will also help us, your event coordinators, by automatically verifying your membership status and Youth Protection Training currency.

Another advantage is that it streamlines the Young Eagle registration form into a single page. (That single page will still have to be signed and mailed to headquarters.)

After you register and log-in, there are several short, simple video presentations you can view if you are having any trouble with any aspect of the website or the process. There is a "Videos" link in the top margin of the website. Pilots who want to fly Young Eagles on their own should view the video titled "How to fly kids outside of a Y.E. Rally (Individual Pilot Flights)."

The system is best used with an internet connection during a Young Eagles event but can be used without the internet by pre-printing the single-sheet registration forms in advance. After the event, when an internet connection is available, the coordinator can very simply match the pilots with Young Eagles and transmit the post-event report.

This is probably more than you want to know about the system. The most important message here is <u>PLEASE LOG ONTO THE SITE AND REGISTER</u>.

Getting Back in the Air

Featuring Tom Turner

Subscriber question:

"I haven't flown for 3 years. Any advice for getting back in the saddle?" -Steven W.

Tom:

"Clearly, after any extended time away from the flight controls, getting some dual flight instruction is in order. If it's been three years, at a minimum you'll need to complete a Flight Review or one of the equivalents provided for in the regulations. This means at least one hour of ground instruction and one hour of flight instruction, and endorsement by a flight instructor. The reality is, however, that this alone won't get you ready to act as pilot-in-command.

First, don't plan to make it back in a single flight. Even if you do well your first time back behind the controls, a single flight isn't enough to ensure you're safe. I tell my students that once is a fluke, twice is a coincidence, but three times is a trend. If you can fly consistently over three flights, with improving performance each time, then you're safe to resume flying as pilot-in-command.

Second, practice everything you needed to demonstrate in order to be certificated as a pilot in the first place. Cover all the items in the Practical Test Standards for at least the Sport, Recreational or Private Pilot. You can cover the Tasks of the Practical Test in about an hour's flying time if your instructor keeps things moving. But I suggest a more moderate

pace just to give you a little time to relax, have fun, and enjoy the view.



Third, focus on the basics. Mastering rudder coordination, airspeed control, angle of attack and stall awareness, and normal and crosswind takeoffs and landings is your goal. Reviewing cross-country navigation and learning the latest avionics are things to do after you've reacquired your basic flying skills.

Fourth, rebuild your skills progressively. Earn your Flight Review, and then practice some local flying. Only after you have a couple of hours of solo flight, try a few short VFR cross-countries to get used to arriving and departing from other airports. Get some night dual before any night flight. If you're instrument rated, get at least 10 or 15 hours before you call your CFII to schedule a return to IFR privileges.

Through this entire process and beyond, become a student of aviation. Continue your PilotWorkshops subscription and participate in the discussions. Take the free AOPA online courses that apply to the flying you do or plan to do. Join the type club for the type of airplane you fly and take any type-specific training it provides.

Professional pilots are safe and proficient because they are required to study constantly and receive training every six months. It stands to reason that a pilot who is not flying all the time should study and train at least that much. And committing to continuous, lifelong learning will make it less likely you'll fall into another three-year flying slump."

Directions to EAA Chapter 64 Hangar/Clubhouse

The Flight Park is located 4 miles SW of Millstadt at 5949 Bohleysville Road, Millstadt, IL.

FROM BELLEVILLE: Take 158 west past Millstadt to Roenicke Rd. (approximately 8 miles.) Turn left on Roenicke for 1.8 miles. Turn Right onto Bohleysville Rd. and go 0.2 mile. Look for the big tree on the left and turn left into the gravel drive.

FROM COLUMBIA: Take Rt 3 through Columbia and take Rt 158 toward Millstadt. Drive 2.9 miles to the intersection where Triple Lakes Rd crosses 158 and becomes Bohleysville Rd—the Farmers Inn will be on your left. Turn right onto Bohleysville Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left at the T-intersection. Continue another 0.9 mile. After you go around an S-curve, you'll see the grass runway on your right. Turn right into the gravel driveway by the big tree and continue to the hangar.

FROM CAHOKIA: Take Triple Lakes road (by the old Cahokia bowling alley.) When you get to highway 158 with the Farmers Inn on your left, continue straight onto Bohleysville Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left at the T-intersection. Continue another 0.9 mile. After you go around an S-curve, you'll see the grass runway on your right. Turn right into the gravel driveway by the big tree and continue to the hangar.

PARKING: There is limited paved parking area in front of the hangar. It's ok to park on the grass or on the gravel parking area in front of the other hangars. Do not block the gravel driveway. It is used by big and wide farm equipment.
