NEWSLETTER QUIZ

Each month, we will ask a "question" in the newsletter. Answers are given at the meeting referenced in the newsletter. At the end of the year, there will be a prize to the person who has the most correct answers. Some will be easy and some difficult.

May Question: What agencies monitor the emergency frequency 121.5 MHz? If you broadcast on 121.5 MHz over KLMO, who hears you?

May Answer: Military sites and many Air Traffic Control facilities monitor 121.5MHz. Chances are your local airport won't be listening to 121.5. If you have an emergency away from an airport with an assigned frequency, broadcast on 121.5. If you are in the vicinity of an airport with as assigned frequency, broadcast on that frequency. 121.5 over KLMO will

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probably not be picked up by the ground personnel, though the folks at Denver ARTCC (in Longmont) do monitor 121.5 and may hear your radio call depending on your altitude.

June Question:

An aircraft desires to make a round-trip flight between LMO and CYS, and the pilot is wondering if the flight will be faster, slower, or the same duration if there is a wind blowing parallel to the route (an exact headwind and tailwind) as opposed to a day with zero wind. Also, assume no time is lost in making the turn at the halfway point. Which wind condition makes for the fastest flight?
