



Unmanned Air Systems (UASs) History and Future Challenges

Rick Brennan presented a program on the history and use of unmanned vehicles going back into the 19th century. This was an excellent program of interest to pilots, model airplane enthusiasts and ordinary citizens. Also had some interesting comments and discussion on what's needed to operate a model airplane under remote control. Thanks, Rick, for a very interesting program on a subject that not many of us know much about and will become a larger part of our aviation paradigm in the future.

A Message from the President

At the seminar at KBJC a week ago, the Garmin representative presented an interesting set of numbers. We had an interesting presentation a few months ago on picking up signals of other airplanes in the area and displaying the information on an IPad or similar device, and now we need to hear about options relating to the FAA mandate.
