

OCTOBER MEETING will be at Columbus Metro Airport Thursday, the 8th, at 7:30 PM. Bring your own folding chair. Come to Van Dusen parking lot at gates 5 or 6. One of our members will be there to show you the way if need be. Chapter business will be brief; see below for details. The program is a workshop in gas welding, which will feature oxyacetylene welding of steel and oxy-hydrogen welding of aluminum. The rudiments will be explained and demonstrated, and you will be given a chance to try it yourself or to show us how good you are if you already know how.


(3) NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE MAKING (NPRM) BY FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION.
On 9-23-81 EAA President Paul sent a 7-page letter of comment and recommendations to FAA in response to the "Ultralight" NPRM 81-6, Docket No. 21631. On 9-24-81 he transmitted a copy of that letter to chapter presidents, saying: "Please encourage your members to write FAA in response to this docket, expressing their own ideas based on EAA's response. It is important we have as many comments as possible....." I heartily recommend that you read Paul's excellent letter and act on it. Our ultralight builder, Dr. Robert Smith, has reproduced a copy for his use. I will make a copy available for the Van Dusen bulletin board through the good offices of Earnie Shelton, and for other bulletin boards upon request. Meanwhile, some specifics of our EAA Hqs position are:

1) Agree on limiting to single place.

2) Recommend 220 lb empty dry weight limit instead of 155: engineering & safety reasons.

3) Rec'm fuel limit of 21 lb (3.5 gal) instead of 15 lb (2.5 gal): safety reasons.
4) Rec'm adding requirement for max wing loading of 3 lb/sq ft at gross wt: Example, the Cricket could be made to meet the ultralight max weight requirement but cruises at 110 mph and with 11.2 lb/sq ft wing loading apparently must land at 50 mph or more.
