

Also just a reminder that the airspace in the immediate area of KBVI falls under the FAA mandate that took effect on January 1, 2020, requiring your aircraft to be fitted with an operational ADS-B transmitter. If your aircraft is certified without an electrical system, then this does not apply to you, however if your aircraft does not meet this exemption, and your flying around anyway, then you're not in compliance and you will be in violation and subject to enforcement at the discretion of the FAA.
