January 27, 2021

The minutes from November were read and approved and the treasurer's report showed a balance of \$7607.07 in checking and the CD unchanged at 4337.92 and the Leroux scholarship at \$10,000. A discussion followed about the need of having this CD. This prompted a motion to be made by John L to close out the CD at the next time of renewal and deposit this into the general fund. John B seconded it and it was unanimously approved.

The January Club meeting had 16 members present with a guest, Ken Foote who became a new member. We celebrated the marriage of Mike and Kelly. Congratulations!



Old Business – At the last meeting John L was asked to look at our finances for the year 2020 and give a current accounting.
