MISSION STATEMENT:

The Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), Chapter 713 of Cody, Wyoming, promotes aviation and aeronautical career training by offering financial support through a Scholarship Assistance Program. Inclusive are various aspects of aviation and aeronautics, but not limited to: commercial pilot, maintenance technician, aviation business administration, aeronautical engineering, air traffic management, etc.

REQUIREMENTS AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANT:

- 1. The applicant should be a resident of the Big Horn Basin of Wyoming.
- 2. The applicant should be a graduate of a Big Horn Basin public, private or home school program and be applying for, or already enrolled in a college aviation degree program or other training program i.e., FAA Part 141 pilot school, etc.
- 3. Applicants pursuing additional commercial professional pilot training must have previously attained a FAA private pilot certificate. The successful applicant also must have a *current* First or Second Class Medical Certificate.
- 4. The goal of the scholarship is to assist the applicant in pursuing a career in aviation or aeronautical science. The successful applicant will receive <u>up to a</u> \$5000 award to be applied toward tuition or

141 program. The applicant may reapply for an additional award for each succeeding semester in order to continue the program to completion. The maximum awards possible under this scholarship program is \$20,000 for 4 semesters. All such awards will be contingent upon available funding in the EAA Chapter 713 Scholarship Fund.

- 5. An EAA Chapter 713 member will be assigned to assist the applicant in the application process.
- 6. Applications must be submitted in advance, allowing for evaluation prior to the term of training.
- 7. An essential part of the application process will be the interview by our Scholarship Committee. If you are a successful candidate, you will be invited to attend a Chapter meeting for introduction to members. Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month and start at 6:00 pm with dinner.
- 8. As a successful candidate, you will automatically become a Chapter 713 member for the current membership year and asked to attend monthly meetings as your schedule allows.
