Secretaries Report:

EAA Board meeting – Feb. 27
President Mike Bond opened the meeting with John B., Karl, John S, and Suzanne S present. Secretary Cebe B, and Fred B, Chuck W, Ken F were absent. The February minutes were read and accepted as read. Karl's treasurer's report stated that we have \$14,943.75 in the Scholarship Fund and \$14,874.17 in the General Fund. He added that the Scholarship balance does not reflect a withdrawal of \$5,000 submitted to a scholarship recipient because the

check has not yet been processed. The General Fund total also does not reflect a deposit of \$180 generated by last Sunday Breakfast donations. Karl stated that he is using his own accounting program and the chapter is no longer being charged for Quick Books by Pinnacle Bank.

Old Business:

Discussion about the Estate Planning letter written by Ken F was tabled due to the absence of board members and will be discussed further during next board meeting. Mike B suggested that that board members create a list of possible donors and submit it to Ken F. Mike B stated that Mike Martin and Cebe B receive reminders to complete the Youth Protection Policy for Young Eagles as soon as possible.

Training and Safety: John B stated that he wants to engage EAA members who are pilots to discuss their personal views about safety issues in flying during the member meeting in March, and to include the idea of a safety briefing in each member meeting. A video about runway safety will be played during the March meeting.

Scholarship: This topic was tabled to next month due to the absence of members. John S stated that three new applicants have submitted

applications and this will be reviewed in March.

Member meeting presentations:

Frank Watson will present his participation in a hands-on assembly of a Cub airplane in Yakima WA at Cub Crafters. John S was also participated in building at the factory. He stated that the process includes an interview with the FAA when the airplane is complete and ready to fly.

Sunday Morning Breakfast: Karl reported 17 people ate breakfast on Feb. 24 and typically there are an average of 12 people who attend breakfast.

Young Eagles: The upcoming event in Gillette WY, and also this chapter's Young Eagles event in the annual Wings and Wheels event in Powell, were discussed. Last year, Young Eagles event was held separate from Wings and Wheels due to safety concerns about combining taxi way and runway space with both drag racing and airplane flying. Ideas of improving safety for Wings and Wheels were discussed and that that discussion will continue during all board meetings before the August event. Miscellaneous: Possible video upgrades for meeting presentations were discussed. John S was granted

permission to reorganize Chapter EAA 713 collection of airplane pictures and other aviation memorabilia. Ideas included displaying information about each picture or photograph, putting up a map of the US so that pilots can illustration their trips with pins and string, asking members to submit pictures of their flights and airplanes, and also making slides of the photos that can be displayed like a slide show on a TV screen.

Support proposed aviation legislation

Ken Foote received a response from WY Senator John Barrasso regarding his letter to WY senators to support legislation that protects access to our remote backcountry flying. Please support this important issue by contacting our WY senators

Dear Ken,

Thank you for taking the time to contact me. It is good to hear from you.

I appreciate hearing your thoughts on S. 2675, the Backcountry Aviation Protection Act. This bill was introduced by Senator Budd (R-NC) on July 27, 2023. It would require the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to add exceptions for inspection passes, training maneuvers, and practice approaches for pilots. Currently, the bill is awaiting consideration before the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Rest assured, I will keep your thoughts on this important issue in mind as the Senate debates the reauthorization of the FAA.

Thanks again for reaching out. I value your input.
