We hope this will help attract some new members to our chapter.






Crossing the Horizon

Soar back to the fearless 1920s with #1 New York Times bestselling writer Laurie Notaro—beloved author of The Idiot Girls' Action Adventure Club—in a stunning historical novel that tells the true, little-known story of three aviatrixes in a race to be the first woman to fly across the Atlantic.

Dld you know that the 1st American woman who died trying to cross the Atlantic was born in Cherokee Villiage, Arkansas? Frances Wilson Grayson, the neice of Woodrow Wilson, died c. December 23,1927 and her body was never recovered. Canada's "Grayson Lake" was named to honor her in 1928.


MidWest Sonex Fly-in
