- Chapter Administration Rick McKinney Pres. presided over meeting and introduced Matt Younkin.
- 1. Matt discussed the "The Freight Dog Files" project he has been working on. The objective of the project is to document and preserve the stories of freight dog pilots from the past. 30- 40 freight dog pilots were interviewed during 2021 Air Venture. Matt told the history of his dad's Beech 18 and how he was able to track it's location and owner down and purchase the aircraft. He also discussed the effort it took to get the plane in airworthy condition again and fly it to another location for further maintenance.
- 2. Martha Molina has received the project material for the EAA kids project workshop and will work with chapter officers to schedule a work session date and location.
- 3. Randy Resh will get with the local AMA group to discuss ways to collaborate with them on the EAA RC model build project.



Misuse of Expense Sharing and Understanding Pilot Privileges

Unauthorized 135 operations continue to be a problem nationwide, putting the flying public in danger, diluting safety in the national airspace system, and undercutting the business of legitimate operators.

This email is a follow-on to the May 2020 Informational Pilot Letter and a continuing effort to remind all pilots to be on the lookout for possible illegal operations. This focuses on two ongoing issues:

- the misuse and/or misunderstanding of expense sharing between pilots and passengers, and
- the apparent lack of understanding of pilot privileges and limitations versus operating rules.

CAN YOU SPOT THE ILLEGAL CHARTER?

Flight sharing, air sharing, time sharing or leasing pool— No matter how they're disguised, illegal air charters are a threat to safety.



Know your Air Carrier / Operator Certification

Part 91 - Generally, cannot be used for compensation or hire.


Part 119 - requires a part 135 or part 121 Air Carrier Certificate when the aircraft is available for hire for air transportation. **Ensure Your Safety**

When hiring an Air Charter, you have the right to see the Air Carrier or Operating Certificate. Ask for it.
