Reservations, paperwork and payment is complete for our three Air Academy participants.


We received \$850.00 in credit dollars from our Young Eagle flights to apply to the fee for the Air Academy participants. Keep flying those Young Eagles.

A Remembrance - Neil Pobanz

Neil Pobanz, a long time member of Chapter 75, passed away May 26th, 2012, at 8:30 pm as a result of complications from a week-long hospital stay at Proctor Hospital in Peoria. Cremation rites were accorded. A private funeral was held on Monday, May 28, 2012.

Each year, all of us would enjoy Neil's presence at our chapter's Emergency Repair Barn, at EAA Airventure, Oshkosh.

Neil was born June 7, 1938 in Geneseo, IL. to Clifford L. and Enid (Drehmer) Pobanz. He was married to Carolyn Hosp, from October 12, 1963 to 1976. He then was married to Judy Hodges, from April 29, 1977 to 1986.

He grew up in Galva, IL., and graduated from Galva High School. He resided most of his life in East Moline, IL but moved to Varna, IL., 1993.

Neil earned Associates Degrees at Parks College and worked on the training fleet as an A&P in 1958. He was also a Cessna dealer at various airports as well as an IA and Service Manager in Moline. From 1961 to 1963 he served in the military, US Army Aviation. After discharge in 1963 he continued employment as a civilian at Rock Island Arsenal as a mechanic, pilot, maintenance test pilot and instructor, retiring in 1993, with 32 years experience in the position of Army Material Command Aviation Officer. In 1993 he was midstate Aviation Inspector and mechanic at Elliott Aviation. In 1995, became Manager of the Marshall County Airport, Lacon Illinois. Was also owner of Lacon Aero Service Inc., FBO. He was also Marshall County Emergency Services and Disaster Agency Coordinator (IEMA).

Was inducted in the State of Illinois, Division of Aeronautics Hall of Fame in 2006.

Was Group Commander Air Force Auxiliary CAP with rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Served as Senior Officer accident response teams, including Senior Missions Coordinator for search and rescue operations and civil disaster situations.

Was appointed by IDOT Division of Aeronautics, to serve on Illinois Terrorism Task Force's Aviation Subcommittee. Former president and presently secretary of Illinois Aviation Trades Association. Was

appointed to the Heart of Illinois Regional Port District which promotes the economic development of six Illinois counties. Assisted in organizing seminars for Illinois AP and IA renewal and also served as a presenter at these events. Was a member of the FAA Aging Aircraft AD Hoc Committee. member of the National Association of Flight Instructors. Member of Professional Aviation Maintenance Association. Neil received many recognition awards including 1994 FAA-Dupage FSDO, Aviation Counselor of the Year, 2001 Illinois General Aviation Maintenance Technician of the Year, 2001, Marshall County Airport Small General Aviation Airport of the Year Award. For nearly three decades served as a Technical Advisor for the American Bonanza Society. Neil was an invaluable resource and tireless in his support of ABS and Beechcraft owners. Neil was very active as an FAA Safety Team Lead Representative in the Great Lakes Region; as an EAA Young Eagles sponsor, ground school instructor and local aviation proponent; and as a volunteer each year in Chapter 75 Emergency Repair Barn at EAA AirVenture. It was a rare day he was not at the airport to help pilots or just be a welcoming ambassador for aviation.

NTSB Spotlights Safety Factors for Homebuilt

The National Transportation Safety Board on May 22nd <u>highlighted 16 recommendations</u> to improve homebuilt aircraft safety, but also complimented EAA and its programs as helping to make the amateur -built aircraft community a safer place.

The NTSB made its recommendations at a full board meeting in Washington, D.C., following a briefing by agency staff on an extensive safety study of homebuilt aircraft that began in 2011. EAA assisted NTSB with an initial survey by encouraging involvement of



EAA members, in an effort to establish an accurate, comprehensive database of the homebuilt community. More than 5,000 EAA members participated in the survey.

Among the areas of focus within the 16 NTSB recommendations were flight testing procedures and plans, (Continued on page 8)

EAA Air Academy Scholarships - Not to Early to Act (from Gina Gore)

Chapter 75 is now recruiting for the 2013 summer EAA Air Academy camp. The academy provides an atmosphere where mature students become totally immersed in the world of flight. Ground instruction and introductory recreation flight experiences highlight this action-packed camp. It combines "in-theair" and "on-the-ground" hands-on activities. The scholarship program encourages, recognizes and supports excellence among EAA members.

Scholarships help outstanding students who demonstrate a strong aviation desire to accomplish their goals. To be considered you should be well rounded, involved in school and community activities, as well as aviation. Academic records should show that you can successfully complete the educational activity for which you are applying. This is a full 100% funded 501 (3) (c) scholarship invested through the Moline Foundation valued from \$680-\$1100 per participant which annually provides tuition of one or more EAA Air Academy scholarships at any level for up to 2-3 youth to attend the EAA Air Academy Session for one week during the summer months. Our chapter has a passion for flying and mentoring the next generation and this endowed scholarship was established to benefit youth who have an interest in aerospace and flight .

To qualify: You must live within the Quad Cities of Illinois, Iowa or outlying areas; ages 14-18 years old; 2.8 minimum GPA, and applicant must have completed a Young Eagle Flight and be an EAA member. The recipient(s) are required to volunteer for 2 chapter events and present a power point presentation for the chapter members in the fall of the year attended to share their experiences with the group. Recipients are responsible for their own transportation to and from the academy.

development of operational limitations and flight manuals for homebuilts, transition training, expanding availability of transition training, and use of electronic data to develop flight test plans and operations manuals.

"One of the most important findings of this study is the number of seasoned and experienced pilots getting into accidents so early in the life of structurally sound airplanes," said NTSB Chairman Deborah Hersman. "The recommendations we issue today can improve safety while encouraging the continued growth of this innovative and vibrant segment of the aviation community."

Hersman and other board members specifically cited EAA's contributions to amateur-built aircraft safety,





and recommended four areas where EAA can expand its programs and play a leading role in enhancing safety.

"We appreciate the NTSB board's unanimous acknowledgement that the amateur-built aircraft community is an important element in the growth and innovation for all of aviation," said EAA President/ CEO Rod Hightower. "We appreciate the praise that the board publicly gave to EAA's programs and efforts on behalf of safety. We understand the need to balance safety with the freedoms that allow Americans to use their imagination and skills to create aircraft that bring new technology and designs."

EAA and its Homebuilt Aircraft Council will continue to study the recommendations for what effect they may have on the design, building and certification of amateur-built aircraft. Any action must ensure that freedom to participate in the amateur-built aircraft community does not create additional burdens.
