The Glasair you have been hearing all about has finally been sold. Below are a write up by Keith Williams and various pictures of the aircraft being prepared for its trip to California.

On Saturday the Glasair project left Iowa for its new home in San Jose, California. Howard and his friend Tom arrived Saturday morning with a pickup truck and 25 foot enclosed trailer. The loading turned out to be just a bit complicated as we had a Glasair with a permanently attached 105" wide tail to fit into a 90" wide trailer. No amount of angling will make that work. After considering the merits of sawing off the tail, to be reattached later in California (a tempting option to some of us), we decided to settle for getting "most" of the project into the trailer. The tail (minus rudder and elevators) are going to ride to California out in the fresh air. Jim Smith led the loading operation with a Chapter 75 crew including Paul and Roy Fisher, Bob Olds and Richard Lowe plus Bill Swaim from the Quad City Aviation Association. I tried to stay out of the way and do as little harm as I could. Bottom line, Chapter 75 and the Quad City Aviation Association have a healthy boost to our High Flight Education Fund and young people in our area will benefit from the donation of the project by Jack Hull. Special thanks to Bob Olds, Richard Lowe and John Vahrenwald who went back out to the airport Sunday morning to help the new owners with some rearranging of the load before the big trip.










