From the Desk of the President



EAA Chapter 75 and Associates,

Not an exciting way to start a newsletter but, we had a business meeting, and the minutes are in as another part of the newsletter. One of the major topics was setting up nomination committees; a representative from each of the active areas of the chapter should be, or is supplying a member to that committee. I will go ahead and make the announcement as I am not continuing as the President of EAA Chapter 75. I believe four years of my style is enough. We need to give someone else a shot at it! Our lifestyles are so wrapped around technology; and with computer capabilities being able to address issues in a manner of expediency and accuracy, there are others that can accomplish this far better than myself.

Oher areas that we discussed are the Ray Aviation Scholarship procedures and applications for next year's Air Academy and scholarships. We're being very proactive and have several applicants already interested. More on that in the future. Now from the younger activities to the older. Nothing wrong with being a legacy member of the chapter. Because we have a lot of knowledge and experience to pass on to our fellow members. One of the areas that we need to readdress is the area of the Davenport Municipal Airport (DVN/KDVN) fixed wing operations involving the t-hangars and Runway 3/21. In the past couple of months with the Boeing CH-47Fs helicopters in operation we've had two incidents. One of them came very close to being more than just an incident! This leads to the fact that those of us that have been around for a while KNOW that when the CH-47Fs are in operation and coming out of their hangar area, they will be doing their pre-flight power checks in the grass, and we don't go near there-we usually avoid that area completely. However, it does complicate trying to get in and out of the t-hangars especially if there is more than one helicopter in a pre-flight operation. When they are doing their pre-flight power checks, they are creating a fairly healthy rotor downwash! They will be announcing on Unicom more frequently, "Be advised of extensive turbulence". So, be advised. Use Aeronautical Decision Making (ADM) skills. Basically, the decision is 'stay away'! The advisory is located in ForeFlight under (a/fd) under the tab of "info". It talks about traffic patterns, then under airport remarks:

Extensive heavy military helicopter training on and involving possible extreme turbulence from rotors. Helicopter Ops on Common Traffic Advisory Frequency (CTAF) operating parallel to runways from grass areas twoway radio communications required for all aircraft conducting multiple Ops. Runway 15 designated calm wind Runway. Enough said on that subject.

Brad Baerwaldt Offering Aircraft Maintenance Support

My name is Brad Baerwaldt, and I'd like to introduce myself and share a little background. I'm a Rotor CFII, PPL (working on my CFII Fixed Wing), and A&P/IA. My aircraft of choice is the Boeing CH-47F Chinook helicopter. You may hear us make loud noises and congest the airfield, but we are a sight to see. After 25 years of service, four combat tours, and over 3500 helicopter hours-1200 of which are with nightvision goggles, I'm retiring from the Iowa Army National Guard on December 31, 2023.

My post-retirement will be centered on rotor and fixed-wing aviation. At some point, I'll start working for Metro Aviation. During my time off between April 1, 2024 - Nov 1, 2024 (warm weather), I'll provide aircraft maintenance support - scheduled and unscheduled, along with annual inspections. But, there is a caveat: I'll only work on fixed gear certificated and experimental aircraft. If there is maintenance outside my scope of work, I have technicians from Elliott Aviation who can assist in performing the job. I am by no means an expert in aviation, but I love learning, flying, teaching others, and maintaining my Cessna Cardinal.
