Special Board Meeting Minutes

Held at Carver Aero Conference Room at the Davenport Airport, Davenport Iowa on June 30th, 2015

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by chapter President Jim Smith at 6:31 pm.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Jim Smith, Dave Jacobsen, George Bedeian, Paul Fisher, Marty Santic and Ron Franck.

THOSE NOT PRESENT: Ed Leahy, Mike Nass & Tom Shelton

OTHERS PRESENT: Mike Nightingale of the Bylaw committee.

REASON FOR SPECIAL MEETING: How to notify the membership of the new chapter 75 Bylaws changes and updates. And also in what way to get a chapter vote, and to approve or disapprove the new changes.

Chapter president Jim Smith presented four different methods of getting the new bylaws to the membership and obtaining the voting results.

After a discussion by the board members on all the methods presented, it was decided to send an e-mail with a cover letter explaining the reason for the vote and an attached copy of the new bylaws. After the members would read the new bylaws they would then reply with a yes or no vote. For those members without e-mail access the chapter would send out copies of the new bylaws by mail and wait for their responses. If we need to contact these members by phone, we will do so. It was also noted that these new bylaws were approved by EAA headquarters at Oshkosh.

For the new bylaws to pass, it requires an 80% majority vote of the total membership. We have 168 members and 135 yes votes are needed to pass.

Mike Nightingale with the help of Marty Santic composed the letter that will be sent out to the membership for their vote on the new bylaws. After the letter was written, it was approved by the board.

IN OTHER CHAPTER BUSSINESS: Dave Jacobsen made a motion to allow Cy Galley \$200.00 for startup funds at the repair barn this summer. Ron Franck seconded the motion and approval by board was unanimous. First Saturday coffee and doughnuts for July has been canceled because it falls on the

WOW! What an Airventure Week!!

Everyone is catching up after an amazing week that was EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2015. By nearly every measurement, the week was a grand success. Official attendance figures released late Tuesday show that the seven days brought more than 550,000 people to the event from a record 80 countries. More than 10,000 airplanes came to the area, including more than 2,600 showplanes. The weather also cooperated, with no measurable rain after a short-lived storm blew through the Oshkosh area on Saturday morning, July 18. The biggest part of our success, however, was the incredibly hard work of 5,400 volunteers in concert with all EAA staff members. Planning and executing the world's largest fly-in, complete with daily air shows, a massive trade show, more than 1,000 forums and workshops, full-time campground, and a major fundraiser is not easy - especially when the unexpected curveballs come our way. Thanks and congratulations to everyone who played a part in this year's success.

SOCIAL MEDIA BIG PART OF TODAY'S OSHKOSH SCENE

Social media has become an important AirVenture connection for those on the grounds as well as those who can't make it to Oshkosh. This year's social and digital media numbers are especially impressive: nearly 600,000 AirVenture web sessions from around the globe; 40,000 downloads of the EAA AirVenture app; AirVenture social media posts reached 82 countries; and EAA's 1,000 photo uploads were viewed nearly 8 million times.

ADVOCACY BATTLE FOR PILOT'S BILL OF RIGHTS HEATS UP DURING FLY-IN

EAA's advocacy efforts already had a full week when additional visibility arrived on the Pilot's Bill of Rights 2 and aeromedical reform via a letter from the Air Line Pilots Association (ALPA) that opposed changes in third-class medical certificates. Jack Pelton spoke at a quickly organized Saturday morning news conference that stated EAA's reaction to ALPA's letter to the U.S. Senate and our continued push to have members contact their senators. Sen. Jim Inhofe also rallied member support at Oshkosh for the bill he authored.

AWESOME EVENING PROGRAM SCHEDULE

If you couldn't find something to do after each day's air show at AirVenture, well, you weren't trying. The Theater in the Woods evening programs were outstanding, highlighted by capacity crowds for Burt Rutan on Tuesday evening and the Apollo 13 crew on Wednesday. Monday's performance by Dierks Bentley drew what might have been the largest AirVenture concert crowd ever, with good crowds for Little River Band on Tuesday and Gary Sinise/Lt. Dan Band on Friday. Good weather also meant the Fly-In Theater films played each night near Camp Scholler to good audiences.

GIVE FLIGHT GIVES HUNDREDS A PART IN AIRCRAFT BUILD

This year's Give Flight project drew more than 2,500 people who pulled rivets to complete five sets of kit aircraft wings. Three of the five sets are already on their way to EAA chapters that will complete an airplane and bring it to Oshkosh in 2017, and the other two sets will be heading out soon. Charlie Becker reports that a highlight of the program was the all-teenager build of the RV-12 wings now headed for EAA Chapter 27 in Meriden, Connecticut. Other chapters receiving wings include Chapter 84 (Snohomish, Washington), Chapter 245 (Ottawa, Ontario), Chapter 461 (Bolingbrook, Illinois), and Chapter 555 (Las Cruces, New Mexico).

GATHERING OF EAGLES BRINGS IN \$2.2 MILLION

The Gathering of Eagles fundraiser on Thursday, July 22, was again a success, with nearly \$2.2 million raised to support EAA's aviation education programs. Nadia Farr reports that the positive energy was evident throughout the Eagle Hangar all night among the more than 1,000 attendees. Some of the highlights included the auction of the Ford Apollo Mustang for \$230,000 and \$50,000 bids for each of two other auction items – an Alaskan adventure and a flight with Red Bull Helicopter pilot Chuck Aaron.

SO ... WHAT ABOUT NEXT YEAR?

The planning for AirVenture 2016 has already begun with discussions on the flightline this year, as well as debriefs with volunteers and area chairs. We're hoping that Burt Rutan's SkiGull and the restored B-29 DOC, which were hoping for Oshkosh in 2015 but couldn't make it in time, will be on the flightline for next summer. In addition, 2016 is the 30th anniversary of the Van's RV-6 and we're planning a big Oshkosh reunion for that very popular kit airplane. More will be announced as plans take shape over the coming months.

Airventure Oshkosh 2015 - Facts and Figures

Comment from EAA Chairman Jack Pelton:

"AirVenture 2015 exceeded our expectations on many levels. With near-perfect weather for the entire event, we filled Wittman Regional Airport and our convention site to capacity with aircraft, campers and cars by mid-week. The depth and variety of our features and attractions ensured something for every aviation enthusiast. Whether it was the static displays and the number of 'firsts' at AirVenture such as the B-52, F-35, and A-350, or the packed exhibits, forums and workshops across the grounds, everyone left knowing that aviation is alive and well in Oshkosh and around the world. The spirit of aviation is strong and the culture of EAA was on full display all week."

Attendance: Approximately 550,000, with a total attendance increase of approximately two percent.

Comment from Pelton: "Our final attendance figure continues to demonstrate strong excitement and renewed optimism for the wide variety of aviation activities offered throughout the week for our members and guests. Highlights included the very popular day and night air shows, the Apollo 13 crew presentation and the return of legendary designer Burt Rutan. The EAA Young Eagles program took delivery of ICON Aircraft's first production A5, and the premiere of EAA's new Aviation Gateway Park drew standing room-only crowds to investigate new aviation innovations, including exhibits and demonstrations on drone technology. On Thursday alone, there were more than 3,100 aircraft movements (takeoffs and landings) over 14 hours, the highest total in at least three years. You could sense the buzz among the attendees, exhibitors and our 5,400 volunteers whose work made the event possible."

Total aircraft: More than 10,000 aircraft arriving at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh and other airports in east-central Wisconsin.

Total showplanes: 2,668 (up 1 percent over 2014) – including 1,031 homebuilt aircraft, 976 vintage airplanes, 350 warbirds, 130 ultralights and light-sport aircraft, 101 seaplanes, 30 rotorcraft, and 50 aerobatic aircraft.

Commercial exhibitors: More than 800, including more than 140 new exhibitors this year.

Forums and Workshops: A total of 1,048 sessions attended by more than 75,000 people.

Social Media, Internet and Mobile: Nearly 600,000 AirVenture web sessions from around the globe; 40,000 downloads of the EAA AirVenture app; AirVenture social media posts reached 82 countries; and EAA's 1,000 photo uploads were viewed nearly 8 million times.

Guests registered at International Visitors Tent: 2,299 visitors registered from a record 80 nations, with Canada (485 visitors), Australia (266), and Germany (204) comprising the top three represented nations. (NOTE: Actual international counts are higher, as these are self-reported figures collected at the International Visitors Tent alone.)

Media: 970 media representatives on-site, from five continents.

What's ahead for next year (July 25-31, 2016)? Comment from Pelton:

"We're not resting, as we're already planning for 2016, with more details available as soon as they're finalized over the coming months. There were aircraft in process that couldn't make it this year, including Burt Rutan's new SkiGull and B-29 'Doc,' that we hope will make an appearance next year. In addition, it's the 30th anniversary of the iconic RV-6 design. We'd like to have a big reunion of these airplanes at Oshkosh. And, of course, there will be plenty of other highlights that you can only see at Oshkosh. Based on the momentum from this year's fly-in, AirVenture 2016 is already one to eagerly anticipate!"




