60th Anniversary of the Emergency Aircraft Repair



AirVenture 2022 marks the 60th anniversary of EAA Chapter 75 member volunteers hosting Emergency Aircraft Repair services for fellow EAA members. Our chapter members Jim Smith, Pete Peterson and Glen Printy, as well as Marvin Hoppenworth, of Cedar Rapids Chapter 33, approached Paul Poberezny in 1962 at the Rockford EAA Fly In, with an idea. They pointed out the need to assist members who flew into the convention, and subsequently needed help with mechanical issues that arose on arrival. It was proposed to erect a tent, near the camping area with tables of tools available for check-out to assist members. Paul's reply was "Git'er done", and the three members drove home that night to gather and mark their tools.

Since then, Emergency Aircraft Repair has expanded and the number of EAAers assisted has continued to grow. Team members assist homebuilders with starting, battery and charging issues, landing gear, struts, wheels, tires, and brakes, magnetos, sparkplugs, engines, towing, welding, prop dressing or replacement, avionics,

skin repair, and a variety of other issues. In addition, assistance is provided to certified aircraft owners for pilot/owner level maintenance items.

When the EAA convention moved from Rockford to Oshkosh, the same services were provided, and a building replaced the tent, to better secure the tools. Our present new building was erected in the 1980s, and we've continued to improve it, insulating the roof in 2018, to make it a bit more comfortable. The availability of John Deere Gators to move volunteers and tools has been a nice addition, and has aided in speedier

Registration Now Open for Pilot Proficiency Center Sessions During EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022

Registration is now open to the expanded Pilot Proficiency Center sessions during EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022, to be held in the new EAA Education Center connected to the EAA Aviation Museum. These half-day clinics allow pilots to increase their knowledge, hone their abilities, and network with other passionate pilots while helping them become safer and better-informed aviators.

The 69th edition of the Experimental Aircraft Association fly-in convention is July 25-31 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. Registration for the Pilot Proficiency Center clinics is free with AirVenture admission, but attendance at each half-day session is limited, so early registration is encouraged. More information and course requirements are available at the Pilot Proficiency Center webpage.

Participants may choose from any one of the sessions that fit their current pilot certificate, rating, or homebuilt aircraft project. Subjects range from flying fundamentals and risk factors to instrument flight and homebuilt test flying. The clinics include keynote presentations, interactive and engaging breakout sessions, skills enhancement, and challenging scenario-based training exercises in EAA's Redbird Advanced Aviation Training Devices.

A pick-up breakfast is included with each morning session and lunch with each afternoon session.

EAA Pilot Proficiency Center clinics are presented by Redbird Flight Simulations, Jeppesen, Hartzell Engine Technologies BOSE Aviation, National Air Traffic Controllers Association (NATCA), and the Hartzell Propeller. Additional support comes from CloudAhoy, Community Aviation, the Society of Aviation and Flight Educators, Mindstar Aviation, and the National Association of Flight Instructors (NAFI).

EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022 Notice Released

There are several important Federal Aviation Administration-approved changes in the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2022 Notice (commonly referred to as the Oshkosh NOTAM), featuring arrival and departure procedures for the Experimental Aircraft Association's 69th fly-in convention on July 25-31 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh. These changes are based on pilot feedback and FAA review of arrival procedure recommendations.

The document is in effect from noon CDT on Thurs., July 21, until 6 a.m. CDT on Mon., August 1, and outlines procedures for the many types of aircraft that fly to Oshkosh for the event, as well as aircraft that land at nearby airports. The Notice was designed by the FAA to assist pilots in their EAA AirVenture flight planning. It is now known as the Oshkosh Notice instead of a NOTAM because of a changed FAA internal procedure.

Some of the 2022 changes include:

- The document is now officially called a Notice by the FAA, rather than a NOTAM.
- Two VORs have been decommissioned (RFD and MBL).
- Several IFR routings have been changed.
- Aircraft camping is no longer allowed at Appleton International Airport (ATW).
- Miscellaneous editorial updates.

The ATC-assignable transition points approaching Oshkosh from the west that will ease holding and congestion will again be in effect in 2022. These points are at Endeavor Bridge, Puckaway Lake, and Green Lake. They will be announced on the arrival ATIS when ATC activates them at times of highest traffic flows.

"The most essential information for any pilot flying to Oshkosh involves reading and thoroughly understanding the 2022 AirVenture Notice to ensure safe operations on arrival and departure," said Sean Elliott, EAA's vice president of advocacy and safety. "Although the designation may have been changed by the FAA, the document still states the official requirements and expectations for pilots. We also urge all pilots to log appropriate cross-country time prior to their trip to Oshkosh so they have the proficiency and confidence to fly safely."

This year's NOTAM cover features a Heritage Flight

formation over Oshkosh. Pilots can download a digital version of the Notice at <u>EAA.org/NOTAM</u>, or order a free printed copy via that website or by calling EAA Membership Services at 800-564-6322.

New EAA Aviation Museum Exhibit Honors Medal of Honor Recipient

A new exhibit that opened April 23rd, in the EAA Aviation Museum's Eagle Hangar honors the late Thomas Hudner, Jr., a Korean War Medal of Honor recipient, with a Corsair aircraft that replaced the one Hudner, Jr. used in his heroic actions that earned him the Medal of Honor.

The airplane has been in the EAA collection for 40 years and was fully restored in 1994 with the markings of World War II ace Kenneth Walsh.

Recent research into the aircraft log books, however, showed the Corsair was a replacement for the Corsair that Hudner, Jr. crash-landed in Korea in 1950 in an attempt to save fellow pilot Jesse Brown, the U.S. Navy's first Black naval aviator. Hudner, Jr. logged

many hours & multiple carrier landings in the EAA aircraft, which after its Navy service was owned by several individuals before it was donated to EAA in 1982.

"When we discovered that our Corsair had a direct connection to a Medal of Honor recipient, it was an easy decision to restore the airplane to its Korean War markings to honor him," said Ron Connolly, EAA Aviation Museum director. "This new exhibit also honors Jesse Brown as a naval aviator and the bond he forged with his squadron mates during that time."

Members of the Hudner and Brown families were at the museum as part of the formal dedication of the display, including Thomas Hudner, III, son of Thomas Hudner, Jr., and Jamal Knight, grandson of Jesse Brown. They also loaned personal memorabilia that also adds to the authenticity of the exhibit.

The Korean War incident that memorialized Hudner Jr. and

Brown is the subject of a soon-to-be-released major motion picture titled Devotion, starring Screen Actors Guild award winner Glen Powell, as well as Jonathan Majors, Serinda Swan, and Joe Jonas. That movie is scheduled to be released later this year, and EAA has been in regular contact with the movie production team in an advisory role.

The gull-winged Chance-Vought F4U-4 Corsair was one of the finest fighter-bomber aircraft produced during World War II. It was a formidable weapon from the closing months of WWII through the Korean War. In Korea, the Corsair was outclassed as a fighter

(though it shot down at least one Chinese MiG-15 jet fighter), and it was used mostly as a ground-attack fighter/bomber. Its speed and ruggedness, and its huge bomb load capacity (rivaled only by late-model P-47s) made it very effective in the ground-attack role.

Corsairs were also flown by the U.S. Navy and Marines, the British Royal Navy's Fleet Air Arm, the Royal New Zealand Air Force, and the French Aéronavale.

Davenport Municipal Airport 3/21 Runway Closure

As of Monday, June 20th, Runway 3/21 will be closed for approximately 4 months.

With the addition of Amazon to our neighborhood, the Iowa Department of Transportation will be conducting repairs/reconstruction of the Division Street bridge where it crosses I-80. In doing so, they will be using a 180' (46m) tall crane for their steel work as well as their concrete pouring. This crane is in direct line with the departure end of Runway 21, and unfortunately, it cannot be avoided.

While the runway is closed, taxi operations on Runway 3/21 are authorized, but I request that you do not taxi to the ends as we will have the Runway Closure X's laid over the runway numbers, and they do pose an engine ingestion problem.

With all of the construction in our area, I highly recommend that you check the NOTAMs prior to each flight.

Up for sale is a 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II project. This experimental canard has a 133.2 TTAF. The original Subaru EA-71 engine was replaced by the builder with a Subaru EA-81 engine at 20.1 hours. The Subaru EA-81 has a Dave Johnson 1.64:1 propeller speed reduction unit with a total of 113.1 hours on it. The propeller that is currently used is a ground adjustable, HPRPM warp drive prop (SER.No.R2800) which has 113.1 hours on it. There are no electrical systems or radios installed. The airplane was last inspected on January 2, 1998 by the builder. The work that needs to be done includes elevators that need to be repaired or replaced and the cooling system which needs to be upgraded and engine tested. This could be a great candidate for electric propulsion. More pictures and questions are quickly available upon request. This aircraft currently has the canard and wings removed for ease of storage. 




