From the Desk of the President

Apparently, I have been abusing it a little bit during my three-point landings, I was actually flattening it to the point where it was rubbing on the bottom horn of the rudder, ever-soslightly, but if it continued it could have possibly inhibited the rudder from moving at the appropriate times, during a landing!! Luckily one of the major aircraft suppliers had one in stock and I ordered it right away. It was received in a matter of a couple of days. I also found a couple of bushings that needed to be replaced in the elevator. The logbooks are now signed, and of course as soon as I was able to fly it, it became very windy, and I haven't been able to actually test fly it, but I have tested the motor and checked out the controls. It truly is a "labor of love" working on this vintage aircraft. It seems as I've said before, work a little, fly a little, work a little more, fly a little more. It's a very labor-love relationship with these older aircraft. Now that I think about it, I'm a very lucky individual. I get to work on aircraft at both ends of the spectrum - on a vintage aircraft, and building one of the newest versions of an RV-12; and along with that, working with some really good people. It's a fantastic life, and I have a lot to be thankful for. You guys that are not involved in the RV-12iS build, you don't know the fun and education that you're missing!

Speaking of a labor of love, the RV-12iS project of teaching young people that are all novices and neophytes, is coming along fine. Building an aircraft



Zeppelin, DC-3 Models Now on Display at the EAA Aviation Museum

EAA Aviation Museum facilities team has completed hanging the DC-3 model that EAA received from EAA member and Automotive Hall of Fame inductee Bob Lutz last month. The model was hung next to the Graf Zeppelin model near the mezzanine that was recently restored by museum docent John Mellberg. What is striking about the pairing (pictured here) is that both models are in 1/36 scale, which gives a better idea of the enormity of the *Graf*

Zeppelin when it was built in the late 1920s. The original zeppelin was 776 feet long, while a DC-3 is 65" long. As a comparison, the Goodyear Wingfoot Three airship that was at AirVenture 2021 is 246 feet long, less than one-third the length of the original *Graf Zeppelin*. John noted that he has shared photos of this display with Bob Lutz, who was very pleased with the way it is presented.

Wittman Regional Airport's Old Terminal Demolished

September 2021 marked the end of an era as the former commercial service terminal served admirably for over 50 years is now gone. Many have fond memories of the airline service days from its construction through 2003, however with the absence of airline traffic for nearly two decades, time has come to say goodbye. Space Walker II Kickoff A Smashing Success

Tool Librarian enthusiastic crowd of helpful aircraft homebuilders attended the reassembly kickoff of John Bruesch's Space Walker II project on Saturday, November 20th at John's garage-shaped "hangar" in Long Grove, Iowa. While some key Chapter 75 members were unable to attend, nevertheless many unaffiliated pilots and builders showed up to assist in consuming a vast array of donuts, including nearly a dozen long-johns an several of the fabled, hard-tofind "Persians." Sprinkles and pudding-filled delights were also in abundance. The hangar reeked of maple and chocolate glaze fumes, but people didn't seem to mind as they pored over plans and examined the woefully unfinished (but newly painted) fuselage structure of the Space Walker II.

The crowd included local North Scott celebrity newsman, Scott Campbell, who asked many insightful questions about aircraft homebuilding, and promised to prepare a six-page feature article in an upcoming issue of his North Scott Press newspaper. Also, on-hand was a satellite van production crew for television's Paula Sands Live, which occupied the Bruesch's entire driveway but had to beat a hasty retreat to Davenport when the hostess learned there were no apple scruff crullers in the morning's buffet layout. Turns out these are a must when shots of Bailey's Irish Cream are also on the menu or requested.

Included in the crowd were a pair of chilled-to-thebone mystery pilots who landed their skeletal Breezys in Dale Grunwald's barren, stubble-clad cornfield behind the Bruesch residence. Rumors quickly spread they might be the ghostly reincarnations of Carl Unger and Arnie Zimmerman consuming copious amounts of steaming hotdogs and several tall ventas of Mary Ann's high-test java, the two refilled their Thermoses and ambled aloft, headed upwind. Before leaving they advised John sternly on the critical need for cabin heat and an enclosed cockpit in the Space Walker's reincarnation.

By now readers have probably noticed there may be a little exaggeration in the above account. The event was still a success, although "smashing" may be too strong of an adjective...OK, so no one showed up. No one, that is, except Tech Counselor Jim Smith, who attended virtually by phone due to a recent injury. While Jim was on the line, we covered a good portion of the day's agenda and digested the usual plethora of ideas and advisements. Alas, the handful of donuts remained uneaten (I had nearly a half-dozen Old Fashioned cake donuts myself, and Jim promised to

make good on a hangar visit once back on his feet). I also spoke with Tech Counselor Terry Crouch, who also promised a visit in the near future.

Regardless, the event got me revved up and (most importantly) my garage cleaned, cleared and rearranged to facilitate a continual rebuilding progress from now on. I also used the day to re-fit the two main spars (front & rear) into the recently re-coated fuselage. The front one slipped in without complaining, but the back required several hours with mechanical and hydraulic tools to admit the wooden spar without damage to it or the fuselage frame. Since Sat., I've also done some paint stripping on the fin, and completed the difficult profiling and cutting of the three replacement floorboards & their mounting hardware. My goal is to show progress in my Builder's Log every week from now on. Spirits are high!



For Sale: 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II N340TD Project \$8,500 (OBO)



Up for sale is a 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II project. This experimental canard has a 133.2 TTAF. The original Subaru EA-71 engine was replaced by the builder with a Subaru EA-81 engine at 20.1 hours. The Subaru EA-81 has a Dave Johnson 1.64:1 propeller speed reduction unit with a total of 113.1 hours on it. The propeller that is currently used is a ground adjustable, HPRPM warp drive prop (SER.No.R2800) which has 113.1 hours on it. There are no electrical systems or radios installed. The airplane was last inspected on January 2, 1998 by the builder. The work that needs to be done includes elevators that need to be repaired or replaced and the cooling system which needs to be upgraded and engine tested.
