### From the Desk of the President



Greetings EAA Chapter 75,

# Chapter Member Eric Dienst Wins Big at the STIHL National Championship Air Races

EAA Chapter 75 member and racing rookie Eric Dienst won first place at the 2021 STIHL National Championship Air Races held September 15-19, 2021 in Reno, Nevada. Eric raced his plane *Outatime* in the Formula One Silver and won with a time of 08:16.747, besting second place winner Scott Holmes (08:51.958) and third place winner Matt Moore (09:03.602).

Competitors completed their qualifying and heats as they vied for places in gold, silver and bronze divisions by pushing their aircraft to fly the fastest on a closed ovoid course.

During the Formula One Silver race, pilot Carl Robinson #57 had to declare a mayday on lap six as his racer, a 1990 Cassutt (N533Z) named *Heat Stroke* lost its canopy.

I originally set a personal goal to try and go 170 mph and discussed this with my crew during the 36 hour drive to Reno, NV. When it came time to qualify, we put down a 185.651 mph speed. We were all caught by surprise, at least I was. But, man did that light a fire under my crew to try and find even more speed. Every heat race the airplane went a little

faster as I tried to adapt to the changing weather conditions. In the final race, the Formula One Silver, we started in the #1 position on what was the most challenging flying conditions I had raced in as the wind was howling and up to the green flag drop none of us knew if we would get to race or not. The flag dropped and I gave it the best I could, flying as constant as I could, and we're fortunate to take the checkered flag and win the Formula One Silver race. It still hasn't hit me yet as it's back to work as normal for me.

I have to thank everyone that's helped along the way, I'd like to thank Cole Dienst for putting up with my wild ideas and for being gone all the time, Steven Miller my partner in the airplane and all around right hand man, my dad for helping with the drive and dealing with my crazy attitude at times under pressure, Justin Phillipson for always calling and pushing me to keep going when I hit a dry spell. Jon and Patricia Sharp for always helping with even the craziest questions, Steve Hill for giving me the opportunity to continue his legacy of building the most winning propellers in Formula One, and everyone else that has taken the time to help me out. I hope I made everyone of you proud because I couldn't have done it without you all. It truly takes a TEAM to make this happen!

# For Sale: 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II N340TD Project \$8,500 (OBO)



Up for sale is a 1989 Viking Dragonfly Mk II project. This experimental canard has a 133.2 TTAF. The original Subaru EA-71 engine was replaced by the builder with a Subaru EA-81 engine at 20.1 hours. The Subaru EA-81 has a Dave Johnson 1.64:1 propeller speed reduction unit with a total of 113.1 hours on it. The propeller that is currently used is a ground adjustable, HPRPM warp drive prop (SER.No.R2800) which has 113.1 hours on it. There are no electrical systems or radios installed. The airplane was last inspected on January 2, 1998 by the builder. The work that needs to be done includes elevators that need to be repaired or replaced and the cooling system which needs to be upgraded and engine tested. This could be a great candidate for electric propulsion. More pictures and questions are quickly available upon request. This aircraft currently has the canard and wings removed for ease of storage. 


